COLLEGE PICKS 34-20 63% UNDERDOG PICKS 8-3 73%

-- Georgia-Auburn was one of the marquee games of the weekend, but it didn't exactly turn out like many had thought. The Bulldogs, No. 1 in the College Football Playoff standings last Tuesday, led at Jordan-Hare Stadium by a 7-6 score after the first quarter. Then, everything went downhill. The Tigers took a 16-7 lead at halftime, but there was still time. However, at the end of three quarters, Auburn held a 30-10 lead and that's when the drama ended. The Tigers improved to 3-0 ATS over their past three, and 5-1-1 ATS over the past seven. They will host Louisiana-Monroe in non-conference action before the Iron Bowl against Alabama. ... As far as the Tide is concerned, they had their hands full at Mississippi State. The Bulldogs held a 21-17 lead after three quarters, and the game was tied 24-24 in the final minute. But unlike UGA, 'Bama showed off their championship pedigree and found a way to win.

-- Miami-Florida hasn't faced an important game at home like last week against Notre Dame in perhaps 15 years or more. But the fans put the 'rock' in Hard Rock Stadium, a rare sold out crowd for the Hurricanes. The home team responded with an impressive 14-0 lead after the first quarter, and a 27-0 halftime lead. The Irish never showed up for the No. 5 vs. No. 6 matchup, as the Hurricanes appear primed and ready for a spot in the Top 4 of the CFP rankings.

-- Oklahoma pushed aside Texas Christian by a 38-20 score, ending the national championship aspirations of the Horned Frogs in Norman. The Sooners improved to 3-0 ATS over their past three and the 'under' for TCU was the sixth straight.

-- Southern California topped Colorado by a 38-24 score in Boulder. How about the closing line for this game? USC was favored by 14 with a total of 62. When the dust settled at Folsom Field, it was the Trojans coming out on top by 14, and both the line and the total ended up as a push.

-- Clemson picked up a 31-14 win at home against Florida State, clinching the Atlantic Division in the process. That sets up a Dec. 2 showdown with Miami in the ACC Championship Game.

-- After a couple of tough losses, North Carolina State hit the road for a difficult game at Boston College. The Wolfpack and Eagles both looked like bowl teams in this defensive battle, with the Wolfpack rattled off a 50-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter to steal a 17-14 win. The 'under' is now 6-1 over the past seven for NCSU. ... Wake Forest posted huge numbers in their win at Syracuse, winning 64-43. The Demon Deacons improved to 3-0 ATS over the past three, and 7-2-1 ATS overall. The 'over' has cashed in four in a row for Wake, too.

-- Wisconsin steamrolled Iowa by a 38-14 score to earn the cover and stay unbeaten on the season. The Badgers improved to 10-0 SU, but Saturday marked the first time all season that they have covered in consecutive games. ... Ohio State bounced back after their embarrassing loss at Iowa City last week, routing Michigan State by a 48-3 score at Ohio Stadium to take control of the East Division in the Big Ten. The 'under' result was the first for OSU in seven games dating back to Sept. 16. ... Minnesota posted a 54-21 win against Nebraska, snapping a two-game losing streak. The Gophers evened up at 5-5 and have a road game at Northwestern and home game against Wisconsin to try and become bowl eligible.

-- Oklahoma State and Iowa State played one of the most exciting games of the day in Ames, as the Cowboys and Cyclones combined for 91 points. It took an interception in the end zone by the Cowboys to dash the comeback hopes of the Cyclones, 49-42. The 'over' has hit in a season-high three in a row for OK State. ... West Virginia picked up an impressive 28-23 win at Kansas State, moving to 7-3 SU, but it was their first cover in four games dating back to Oct. 14. ... It was a rare 'over' result for Kansas, who slipped up 42-27 at Texas. The 27 points were the most for the Jayhawks since they posted 34 in a game on Sept. 23 against West Virginia.

-- Arizona got back on track with a 49-28 win against Oregon State, improving to 6-4 ATS overall and 3-0 ATS across their past three at home. The 'over' has come through in six straight for the Wildcats. ... Washington State had a tough challenge at Utah, but they were able to hold off the Utes by a 33-25 score. The Cougars improved to 7-2 ATS over the past nine outings. ... It was a rare 'over' result on Friday night for Stanford, as they effectively ended the playoff chances of Washington by a 30-22 count. The last over for the Cardinal came way back on Sept. 23.

-- The free fall for Florida continued, as they lost to old pal Will Muschamp and South Carolina. The Gators started out 3-1 SU, but probably could have lost games to Tennessee, Kentucky and Vanderbilt. Remember those early-season, late game heroics? Well, the Gators are 0-5 SU over their past five, and 0-4 ATS across the past four, and 3-6 SU and just two games to go, they have no chance at a bowl game. Meanwhile, South Carolina improved to 4-0-1 ATS over the past five outings. ... Louisiana State picked up a 33-10 win against Arkansas, improving to 4-0 ATS over the past four games after opening 1-4-1 ATS in their first six.

-- In the AAC, UCF remained unbeaten with a 49-24 win against Connecticut. The Golden Knights were unable to cover for the third straight outing after opening the season 5-0-1 ATS in their first six. ... Navy put an end to their three-game losing skid, outlasting Southern Methodist by a 43-40 score. It was the first cover for the Midshipmen since Sept. 30 against Tulsa. ... Tulane survived at East Carolina, 31-24 in overtime, to pick up their fourth win in 10 games. The Green Wave still has a chance at bowl eligibility, but they need to win their two remaining games against Houston and at SMU.

-- Florida Atlantic keeps moving through uncharted territory. They improved to 6-0 in Conference USA play with a 48-23 win at Louisiana Tech. The Owls opened the season 1-3 SU, but they have won six in a row and they're 5-1 ATS during the span. ... Alabama-Birmingham kept up their impressive play, winning outright against Texas-San Antonio despite entering as eight-point underdogs on the road. UAB has won three in a row, and five of the past six, while improving to 7-1 ATS over their past eight. They step out of conference for a trip to Florida next weekend.

-- Hawaii was unable to come back and top Fresno State, slipping up 31-21. It was the fifth consecutive 'under' for the Rainbow Warriors, who also slipped to 0-8 ATS dating back to Sept. 2. ... Nevada will not be bowling this December, and bettors will be sad to see them go. The Wolf Pack improved to 4-1 ATS over their past five games following a 59-14 thumping of San Jose State. ... Wyoming posted a 28-14 win at Air Force, their seventh consecutive cover and fourth straight 'under' result.

-- South Alabama picked up the 24-19 win against Arkansas State, the biggest underdog to win outright (+12.5). The 'under' continues to be a popular play for USA, hitting in three in a row and eight of the past nine. ... Georgia Southern slipped to 0-9 SU with a 27-6 loss at Appalachian State. The Eagles also slipped to 2-6-1 ATS overall.

-- The TCU-Oklahoma game had a total of 63.5. Things were looking great for 'over' bettors at halftime, with the Sooners leading 38-14. However, the entire third quarter was scoreless and there was just six total points in the fourth quarter for the shocking 'under' result. -- If you had Florida State (+16.5) and the 'under' (44.5), you were likely swearing at the end of their game at Clemson. Other total bettors had to settle for pushes on both ends after it appeared a win was surely in the bag. The Tigers punched in a touchdown with 3:05 to go, taking a 24-14 lead. That looked like it might be the final margin, but Clemson ended up posting another rushing touchdown with just :35 remaining for the awful bad beat on both the total and the line. Michigan State-Ohio State appeared headed for an 'over' (56.5) result. The Buckeyes led 35-3 at halftime, and 48-3 after three quarters. However, neither Sparty nor the Buckeyes were able to tack on any points in the final quarter, resulting in a stunning 'under' result. -- LSU was laying a big number (+18.5), but it didn't appear they were going to cover until the Tigers posted a score with 3:46 to go, taking a 33-10 lead on Arkansas. -- For the second straight week it was FAU involved in a bad beat in the final minute. The total was 68, and the Owls had the ball and a 42-23 lead. With :37 left in regulation the Owls punched in a 3-yard touchdown to take a 48-23 lead and a miraculous 'over' result for some, and a sickening 'under' loss for others.

NORTHERN ILLINOIS -9.5 Over Western Michigan by 17

The combinations of possibilities over the course of these last two games of the year in the MAC West are borderline ridiculous. The one thing I know for sure is that Toledo controls its own destiny. Two wins for the Rockets, and they're in the MAC Championship Game. Though that's the most likely scenario, Western Michigan is in really good shape right now as well. The Broncos do finish their year at Northern Illinois and at Toledo, but wins in those games and a Northern Illinois win over Central Michigan next week would send the Broncos to the MAC title game. Northern Illinois could still win the MAC West with two wins to end the season and a Toledo loss to Western Michigan. Ironically, the winner of this game is going to be rooting hard for loser of this one to not give up next week to keep their conference title dreams alive.

Western Michigan is in this spot thanks to the fact that it suffered a pair of inexplicable home losses to Akron and Central Michigan in conference play. The team has been great on the road, beating Buffalo and Eastern Michigan in a pair of overtime games to stay in the title race, but these two duels are obviously the biggest of the year.

Northern Illinois has largely done what was expected of it this year. The team upset Nebraska but lost to both Boston College and San Diego State in close games. A 27-17 loss at home to Toledo wasn't totally unexpected, and last week's 63-17 romp over Ball State was proof of just how dangerous this team can be when it's operating at its best.

With Jon Wassink out for at least the next two games with a collarbone injury, the offense for Western Michigan boils down to how well "freshman" Reece Goddard can handle the pressure. Last week's win over Kent State was a good game to get his feet wet, but I know that tallying 389 yards against a team like Northern Illinois isn't going to cut it. The Golden Flashes have a woeful offense that was never going to keep up if the Broncos got into the 30s in scoring. The Huskies are a far different story. Goddard is a mobile threat, but he's an awful passer. The frosh has completed just 40 percent of his passes this year and has 35 runs for 35 yards and a touchdown in limited duty.

I can't trust Goddard in a situation like this. Jarvion Franklin is a great tailback, and he's going to make some plays in this game, but Northern Illinois has a top-25 defense nationally and should contain this WMU offense. This could be a slugfest in the end, but I'll gladly play Northern Illinois in its quest to get back into the MAC Championship Game.

SOUTH FLORIDA -22 Over Tulsa by 31

South Florida has to keep looking at the College Football Playoff rankings and wondering where its name is. The team is 8-1 on the season and has, for the most part, crippled teams. A shocking 28-24 loss to Houston at the end of October ended the nation's longest-ever streak of games scoring 30+ points. The good news is that the Bulls aren't finished yet. They made short work of UConn two weeks ago in their last game, and it's essentially assured that two wins to end the regular season plus a victory over Memphis in the AAC Championship Game will put them in the New Year's Six, most likely in the Fiesta Bowl. If you haven't seen the USF rushing attack in full-throttle, this is a game for you to take in. Darius Tice, Quinton Flowers and D'Ernest Johnson are all pointed towards 1,000-yards seasons for the Bulls, and when these guys get going, it really does look like a track meet on the field. Don't forget, too, that Marquez Valdes-Scantling might be the best athlete of the bunch. He leads the team with 44 receptions for 720 yards and five touchdowns, and he's also had his hands on the ball seven times for 109 yards as a rusher.

The easy answer is that the Golden Hurricane just don't have the offensive talent this year they're used to having, and their defense hasn't been able to make up the difference. Freshman Shamari Brooks' season is over thanks to a broken collarbone, and D'Angelo Brewer is really the only other man on this offense capable of putting up huge stats. Brewer leads the team with 1,099 yards and eight touchdowns, but it's been proven time and time again that he can't run this show by himself.

When the Bulls got beaten by Houston, the man who was largely in the middle of it all was Ed Oliver. He was a legitimate 5-star recruit out of high school, the first ever to sign with a Group of Five team. He single-handedly wrecked the game for USF. Tulsa's defensive line is NOT exactly full of 5-star guys. Jesse Brubaker is a three-year starter at defensive end for the Golden Hurricane, but that's not exactly a ringing endorsement. He's one of just three seniors on this entire defense, and the unit has lacked a tremendous amount of leadership consistently over the last several years.

To say that Tulsa's No. 128-ranked rush defense is going to have problems in this game would be an understatement. If the Bulls' offensive line is pushing the Tulsa defensive front around, this is going to be a long game for Tulsa and one in which USF could dump a 50 burger on the board quite easily. I have no doubt that South Florida is going to score a bunch of points with ease.

NEW MEXICO +1 Over UNLV by 7

There was a point that this season looked rather promising for New Mexico. The Lobos had no business losing to New Mexico State in Week 2, but after a close game at Boise State, a huge upset at Tulsa and a mild upset against Air Force, this was a 3-2 team that looked good for a bowl game. Since that point, the Lobos have forgotten how to play offense, scoring just a total of 54 points in their last five games, all of which ended in losses. Of course, it doesn't help that this team doesn't have a legitimate quarterback. The Lobos are pretty much guaranteed to not have a 1,000-yard passer this season considering that the two leaders, Lamar Jordan and Tevaka Tuioti have 593 and 549 yards respectively.

UNLV still has a shot at making a bowl game this year, but those chances took a huge hit last week when the Rebs lost their final home game of the season against BYU 31-21 (one of our losses last week). It wasn't quite as bad as the 43-40 defeat against Howard that kicked off the campaign, but the results will still feel the same. That was a game the Rebels really had to win if they realistically wanted a shot at playing December football, and they punted the performance on national television. The nation's No. 121-ranked rush defense was a horrible nightmare against BYU. Squally Canada, a man who had been bottled up all season long, had over 200 yards on the ground against the Rebels, and that could be bad news against a New Mexico team that really only knows how to run the football.

What in the world happened to Richard McQuarley and Tyrone Owens in the New Mexico backfield over the course of these last few games? McQuarley was thought to be a 1,000-yard back this season after rumbling for 656 yards as a junior, And Owens already was coming off of a 1,000-yard campaign last year and has been a complete dud this season. The trouble really has stemmed from these last three games, though. These two men have combined to rush for just 85, 81 and 57 yards in the Lobos' last three combined. With as poor as the passing game has been every step of the way this year, it shouldn't be a huge surprise that New Mexico has scored a total of just 27 points in those three games. If the Lobos are getting back in the win column, both of their featured tailbacks will need to be proficient.

The Rebels are coming off of a game most didn't expect them to lose to BYU, and New Mexico looks like a team that has checked out for the season. That said, let's remember that the Lobos have had some good performances here in Albuquerque this season, including the 56-point outburst against Air Force and a near miss in a 27-24 loss to a really good Colorado State outfit. This is a close spread for sure, but the matchup between the Lobos' running attack and the UNLV defensive front should be an advantage to the hosts. I think a TV game will wake the sleeping Lobos and I will back them in this spot. **This is a Friday night game.**

OHIO STATE -38 Over Illinois by 45

The Illini are playing short, with a total of 18 scholarship players at the moment, and this has really marred their season. They're the only winless squad in the Big Ten, and they surely aren't winning this one either at the Horseshoe. Cam Thomas was the hip, new thing in Illinois, taking over as the team's starting quarterback for Chayce Crouch and Jeff George Jr. He's shown a real spark for this offense and played sufficiently against Purdue two weeks ago before getting hurt at the end of the game. Thomas missed the Indiana game last week with that undisclosed injury, and we're not sure whether he's going to be able to give it a go this week against Ohio State.

Not that it really matters. The Buckeyes still have one of the most talented teams in America even if their National Championship dreams are quite possibly permanently shattered. Or are they? You never know with all the upsets. Ohio State had every reason to lay an egg against Michigan State last week. The Buckeyes were coming off of what will probably serve as a season-ending loss to Iowa, and the only thing they legitimately have left to play for is a spot in the Rose Bowl. With a good Spartans outfit coming from East Lansing, the Bucks could have easily been beaten for the second time this year at the Horseshoe. The OSU offensive line was having none of it. A week after this team was punched in the mouth by Iowa, the Buckeyes dominated up front on both sides of the ball in a 48-3 victory. Mike Weber and J.K. Dobbins combined for 27 carries and 286 yards. Weber scored a pair of TD's in his biggest game of the season.

JT Barrett has thrown 6 picks in his last two games combined. This was a man who had thrown just one pick in his first eight games. No one on the Illinois defense has picked off more than two passes this year, and the team only has eight picks for the season. It's going to take one heck of an effort defensively for the Illini to force Barrett into these types of mistakes. Against teams that were unranked coming into Week 11, Barrett averaged 274 yards per game and had 21 touchdowns with no interceptions. Good luck, Illinois. Not surprisingly, not only did Barrett play incredibly well in those games, but the scores were ridiculously lopsided, too. Those six games we mentioned earlier had final scores of 49-21, 38-7, 54-21, 56-0, 62-14 and 56-14. If the Buckeyes are going to play as well in this game as they have against the rest of the minnows of the Big Ten, this game will end up being a romp and Urban has no sympathy in rolling up scores.

Michigan +8.5 Over WISCONSIN by 1

There is perhaps no team in America disrespected more than the Wisconsin Badgers. Sure, their schedule hasn't been anything to write home about this year, but this is a team that has whooped up on every team it has faced. If it can say the same about the Michigan Wolverines on Saturday, you'd like to think that would remove at least some of the doubt the College Football Playoff Selection Committee has about this team. With the wild day that happened on Saturday, there is more than one two-loss team that could find itself in front of the Badgers on Tuesday when the newest College Football Playoff rankings come out. There's a legitimate question as to whether this Wisconsin team really has a path to the playoff even though it is undefeated. It's going to take a lot more in the way of chaos at the top of the rankings to assure that the Badgers are going to have their shot. Regardless, the best Wisconsin can do is to keep on doing its job and winning. This is a team that ranks No. 2 in America in total defense and No. 23 in scoring offense. It's hard to ask much more than that, even with the lousy schedule the Badgers have been up against.

Michigan might have lost those two games to Michigan State and Penn State, but what really separates this team from Penn State or Ohio State at this point? In our eyes, not a heck of a lot. Jim Harbaugh's team is a perfect 8-0 otherwise, albeit against a schedule that hasn't been a lot to write home about. Since losing for the second time this season, the Wolverines took care of business against Rutgers, Minnesota and Maryland to setup these huge last two games of the season. Big Blue can't win the Big Ten without some more help, but the fact that they can still win 10 games and finish up with wins over the Badgers and Buckeyes could put them into the New Year's Six. Brandon Peters has taken over under center and is at least showing a bit of competency as a thrower. He has only thrown 46 passes in his career, but Peterson is averaging 7.2 yards per pass attempt and most importantly, has yet to throw a pick this year. Michigan has ripped off six 30+ yard runs in their last three games combined. Michigan didn't have any of those explosive running plays against Maryland, but it didn't need it to put the Terps down. That said, the wins over Rutgers and Minnesota both featured huge gains on the ground by both Karan Higdon and Chris Evans, men who are only playing extensively due to the fact that Ty Isaac is injured. The Wolverines have shown that they don't need a heck of a lot of offense to win games, though those solid offensive possessions could be really hard to come by against a Wisconsin team that has a stout defense.

This is the biggest moment of the season for the Badgers, but we're not sure they're up to the challenge, even though we used them as best bets the last two weeks. Beating Northwestern and Iowa was one thing, but regardless as to what the rankings say, this Michigan team is the best team that has shown up on their schedule this year. Alex Hornibrook has been fantastic at times this season, but he's not an elite quarterback by any stretch of the imagination. This is also easily the best defensive Jonathan Taylor has seen in his young career. We expect this to be a throwback to old school Big 10 football. Three yards and a cloud of dust in a low-scoring slugfest where three touchdowns might be enough for either offense to seize control and win this game. We're going to call for Michigan to win straight up as our underdog pick.

NFL Football Recap

-- The New Orleans Saints rolled up an impressive 47-10 road win against the Buffalo Bills, posting six rushing touchdowns in the process. The Saints started out 0-2 SU/ATS, but they're a perfect 7-0 SU/6-1 ATS during their current seven-game winning streak. Next up is a home date with the Washington Redskins and a high-anticipated battle on the road against the Los Angeles Rams. Not many believed, even a few weeks ago, that a former NFC West battle between the Rams and Saints would have playoff implications.

-- The San Francisco 49ers didn't look like a winless team in their 31-21 victory against the hapless New York Giants, earning the straight-up win and cover as short 'dogs at home. The team traded for QB Jimmy Garoppolo to be their quarterback of the future, but rookie QB C.J. Beathard accounted for three total touchdowns and there is no hurry to thrust Garoppolo in before it is time. The 49ers did enter the game with a total of just 30 points over their past three games, 10 points in each outing. The 'over' has cashed in four of their past six outings thanks mostly to the fact they have given up 20 or more points in six straight games.

-- Sunday Night Football hit the 'over' for the second consecutive week, as the New England Patriots mowed down the Denver Broncos, 41-16. Over bettors were helped by several miscues on special teams which led to plenty of early points, including a muffed punt deep in Denver territory which gave the Patriots favorable field position, and a kickoff return for touchdown midway through the first quarter. The 'over' was a frequent occurrence for the Pats early on, going 4-0 through their first four games, but they tightened up on defense and posted four straight 'under' results until SNF.

-- The game with the lowest total on the board -- Green Bay-Chicago (37.5) ended up inching over thanks to a flurry of scoring in the final quarter. The teams had combined for just 19 points through the first three quarters, and 'under' bettors were on the right side. However, there were 10 total points in the final 5:29 to push the total over the finish line for 'over' bettors. This game was aided by five field goals of 40-plus yards, a 37-yard TD run and a 46-yard TD reception to go over.

-- The Dallas-Atlanta (49) game offered the highest total on the board, but the 'under' was never in doubt. The Cowboys offense looked disjointed as they adjusted to life without RB Ezekiel Elliott, serving the first of a six-game suspension, and while understudy RB Alfred Morris did a good job, it was the offensive line that did the Cowboys in. OT Tyron Smith was inactive, so DE Adrian Clayborn had a historically good day taking advantage of the patchwork line. He recorded six sacks, second-most in a single game in NFL history, and a new Falcons franchise record.

-- The 'Over/under' split in the first two primetime games of Week 10, and the 'over' is 19-12 (61.2%) through the first 31 primetime games of the 2017 season with Monday's Miami Dolphins-Carolina Panthers game still on tap. Officially, the 'over' finished 27-24 (52.9%) through 51 games under the lights in 2016. In 2015, the over finished 20-28-1 (41.7%) in 49 primetime games. In 2014, the over went 33-17 (66.0%) in primetime games, and the over was 28-22 (56.0%) in 2013.

-- Colts QB Jacoby Brissett (concussion) reported concussion-like symptoms after Sunday's game, the result of a helmet-to-helmet hit that wasn't even flagged. He'll have two weeks to recover with the team on a bye in Week 11.

-- Falcons RB Devonta Freeman (concussion) was forced out of Sunday's game against the Cowboys, entering the NFL's concussion protocol.

-- Packers RB Aaron Jones (knee) suffered a medial collateral ligament sprain in Sunday's game, and he'll have an MRI on Monday to determine how much time he will miss. RB Ty Montgomery (ribs) also checked out early and did not return.

-- Texans WR Will Fuller (ribs) sustained an injury to his ribs in the first half and he was unable to return to the game.

-- For the second consecutive weekend the NFL schedule features just two divisional matchups. Lions and Bears will do battle in Chicago and the Eagles and Cowboys will hook up in a SNF battle.

Kansas City -10 Over NY Giants by 18

Since winning and covering their first five games of the season, the Chiefs stand 1-3 straight up and against the spread in their last four. The bye week couldn't have come at a better time. It will have allowed the team to get healthy and reenergize for the stretch run. Alex Smith has been one of the better stories in the league this season. He's thrown for 2,444 yards and boasts a stellar 18:1 TD/INT ratio. That lone pick was thrown last time out against the Cowboys. Making his job that much easier has been the 1-2 receiving punch of Travis Kelce and Tyreke Hill who've combined to reel in half his touchdown passes. KC's offense exploded with Kareem Hunt. He's been quiet over the last month. The time off will help him get back on track.

The GMEN enter this tilt the owners of the league's No. 25 ranked total offense and No. 29 ranked scoring offense. Pair that terrible production with a defense that concedes the second most yards and third most points, and it hardly comes as a surprise to see Eli Manning and company entering this matchup owners of a 1-8 record. Seven of the Giants last eight overall opponents have scored at least 24 points, and now the unit has to go up against one of the more offensive balanced teams the league has to offer.

If there's one area the Chiefs aren't very good in, it comes on the defensive side of the ball. Surprisingly, KC's defense has been every bit as bad as New York's with it giving up over 390 yards per game (No. 30) and over 23 points per game (No. 20). It's been bad defending both the run (No. 30) and the pass (No. 28), but the Giants don't have a ground attack capable of taking advantage on the ground. Due to that, Shepard is going to need to step up once again and lead the way through the air. He enters this tilt off arguably the greatest game of his career after reeling in 11 passes and turning them into 142 yards.

McAdoo has completely lost this team. They just got their butts kicked by the Bay, and get to return home to play one of the AFC's best. I simply can't see them getting up for this one. The betting public disagrees with that sentiment with the betting line for this tilt is down to -10 after opening -12.5 at the sportsbooks. Even more shocking is that 70 percent of the handle is riding KC. Some smart money think NY rises to the occasion. I beg to differ. The time off was exactly what Kansas City needed, and Andy Reid has led his squad to three straight wins and covers off a bye. The Giants have been defeated by an average of 25.5 points in the two games they were dogged at home in this season. I see no reason to fade that streak on a team that looks to have given up with a lame duck coach calling the shots. I'll back the Chiefs.

DJ PRO FOOTBALL BEST BET

Jacksonville -7.5 Over CLEVELAND by 14

The Jaguars really had no business beating the Chargers last week. They were behind 17-14 in the fourth quarter and couldn't get out of their own way offensively. That said, the defense saved this team yet again, picking up a fumble and forcing three other three-and-outs in the final stanza to give the offense just enough chances to tie the game and send it to overtime. From there, it was the defense yet again that picked off a pass, setting up the game-winning score. That's been the M.O. for the Jags all season long. Run the ball. Be safe on offense. Play lockdown defense. Do just enough in the fourth quarter to win. That's why the Jags have won three straight games and why they're set to be relatively big favorites in each of their next three games before Seattle comes to town on December 10.

Cleveland is once again the last team in the NFL sitting with a bagel in the win column. The Browns still only have one win under Hue Jackson, and it's fair to assess how many more losses he could possibly amass before getting fired. Cleveland really hasn't been close to victory all that often. The team had a double-digit lead for the first time this season against Detroit last week and still didn't cover the 10.5-point spread. The Browns are just 2-7 ATS on the season, proving that they're legitimately even worse than what sportsbooks expected of them. Not that it really matters who is quarterbacking the Browns for betting purposes, but keep an eye on DeShone Kizer. He left last week's game in the fourth quarter in Detroit with an upper body injury that could keep him out of this game. If so, expect to see Cody Kessler under center.

It finally seems as though the investment that has been put into this defense is coming to fruition. The signing of A.J. Bouye from Houston seems to be the last piece to the puzzle. Jalen Ramsey should seriously be considered for Defensive Player of the Year honors because of his impact on this defense and Myles Jack is quietly having a tremendous season at strongside linebacker. Toss in the fact that Calais Campbell has a whopping 11 sacks on the season to lead a pass rush that isn't far off of the pace to break the NFL record for team sacks in a season, and it's no wonder why this team ranks No. 1 in the league in scoring defense. This is becoming a legitimately feared unit.

It's going to be incredibly square to play Jacksonville. At some point, the Browns will cover a game, and I bet they'll probably win one somewhere along the way, too. But I'm not getting off the Jags train until it hits a broken track.

LA Rams +2.5 Over MINNESOTA by 6

Everything is starting to come full circle for Sean McVay's Rams. Initially, it was the offense that was setting the tone to allow for the team to get out to what was then considered a surprising 3-1 start. But since giving up 30 points to the Cowboys in Week 4, the defense has really started to come around. After holding the Texans to just seven points last week, LA's defense will enter this tilt owners of the No. 4 ranked scoring defense in the league (18.0 PPG). No opponent has found a way to score more than 17 points against the stop unit in the team's last five games. With road wins already in tow versus Dallas and Jacksonville, this trip to the Twin Cities won't have Jared Goff and company the least bit nervous.

Since dropping a tough 14-7 decision to the Lions back in Week 4 in a game that saw Dalvin Cook go down for the season, Mike Zimmer's troops have rattled off five straight victories and done so in an impressive fashion. They'll return home for this matchup off back-to-back road wins and covers at Cleveland and Washington to catapult themselves to the top of the NFC North standings. Though it trailed on three separate occasions in the first half versus the Redskins, Minnesota still kept the pedal to the metal enough to secure the 38-30 win and cover. Case Keenum had himself a game throwing for over 300 yards to go along with four touchdown passes.

Much of the Rams offensive success has been the result of a revamped ground attack that's punished the opposition to the tune of 129 yards per game (No. 5) at 4.2 yards per carry (No. 11). Todd Gurley is back on the scene as one of the best running backs in the league, and he'll need to shoulder much of the load if the Rams passing offense is to get much of anything done against a tough as nails Minnesota defense. The Vikings allow just over 81 rushing yards per game (No. 3), but has been beatable at times through the air (No. 12). Kirk Cousins just lit the secondary up for 327 yards last week, but only managed one touchdown. Should Gurley find success on the ground, it will make Jared Goff's job easier.

I'm not buying any Vikings stock this week. Minnesota's current win streak has come against Chicago, Green Bay, Baltimore, Cleveland and Washington. The only possible playoff entrant is the Packers. While LA's best recent win came against Jacksonville, I still forecast it as being the more complete team in this matchup. That could all change if Jerick McKinnon and Latavius Murray find success on the ground, but even if they do, I'm not buying Case Keenum as the offense's savior. He's got a heck of a receiving corps to get the pigskin to evidenced by Adam Thielen blowing up last week, but I question his ability to get them the ball with the amount of pressure Los Angeles is sure to bring his way. I was surprised to see the Vikings as 2.5-point favorites. Doesn't matter though. LA wins outright!

Off last week's huge 17-14 outright win in front of the "12th Man", the Redskins were a very popular pick heading into their Week 10 home tilt with the Vikings. So much that they got steamed all the way to 1-point favorites before closing as 1-point underdogs. The outlook looked good early on with Kirk Cousins leading the team to three separate leads, but it all fell apart right before the break with Minnesota scoring two touchdowns less than two minutes apart.

They will hit the gridiron confident for this one knowing its already logged road wins at the Rams and Seahawks. For all intents and purposes, it had Kansas City on red alert as well before everything crapped the bed late when it mattered most. It's tough to get excited about them in this matchup though due to their 14 committed turnovers. Especially in the interception department where the Saints thrive.

Drew Brees is the leader of the league's No. 5 ranked passing attack, but it's the ground game that's setting the tone for the offense. The 1-2 punch of Mark Ingram and rookie Alvin Kamara has been lethal with the duo combining for nearly 1,100 yards rushing and over 500 yards receiving. On top of that, they've combined for 13 touchdowns!

The Redskins give up just under 110 rushing yards per game at 4.2 yards per carry. That's not good entering a matchup like this against a Saints offense relishing the fact that it finally has one of the best ground games in the NFL. Washington just gave up 100 yards and a touchdown to a much lesser rushing attack of the Vikings. This isn't going to be a walk in the park. Once Ingram and company force the Skins to make adjustments up front, that's when Brees is going to take advantage of their leaky secondary that's conceded an average of 235 yards per game (No. 18) and just allowed Case Keenum to throw for over three spins.
