

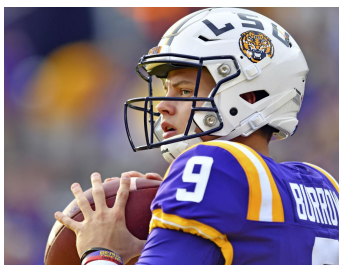

SEC TUSSLE IN TUSCALOOSA LSU AT ALABAMA



AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE (AAC)

-- SMU-Memphis was front and center on the nationally-televised stage on ABC, and the combatants did not disappoint. The Tigers outlasted the previously unbeaten Mustangs by a 54-48 count, hanging on for the cover. The 'over' (72) cashed yet again for SMU, going to 8-0-1 in their eight games overall. The Tigers are 5-2 ATS across the past seven, and the 'over' has hit in their past six, too. ... Navy rolled Connecticut by a 56-10 count on Friday night, and they're not 4-1 ATS in the past five, and 6-2 ATS across their eight games overall. The 'over' is also 5-1 in Navy's past six. ... East Carolina gave Cincinnati all they could handle in a 46-43 victory which required a game-winning field goal at the buzzer. The lead went back and forth, and ECU led by 12 at the end of three quarters before Cincinnati woke up. ECU has dropped four in a row to slip to 3-6 SU, but they're 4-1 ATS over the past five and the 'over' is 3-0 to make bettors happy.

ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE (ACC)

-- Miami-Florida State used to be the most anticipated game of the season in football, but not it is a bit of an afterthought with both teams having down years. The Hurricanes have won and covered three of the past four, moving within one win of bowl eligibility. They have covered in consecutive games for the first time this season, too. As far as FSU is concerned, they're 4-5 SU and 3-5-1 ATS overall. They're still a friend to bettors, however, as the 'under' has connected in six in a row. ... Virginia Tech gave Notre Dame a tremendous fight in South Bend, coming up just short by a 21-20 score, as the Irish bounced back from their beatdown at the Big House last week. The Hokies entered the game averaging 39.7 PPG, and they're still 3-1 ATS over the past four despite Saturday's loss. ... Pittsburgh won an unimpressive 20-10 defensive battle at Georgia Tech. The Panther attained bowl eligibility, moving to 6-3 SU, and they're 3-1 ATS over the past four while hitting the 'under' in three straight, and seven of the nine games overall. ... Boston College went to the Carrier Dome and hammered Syracuse by a 58-27 count, as the Orange have now dropped four in a row while failing to cover five straight. They're 1-7 ATS over the past eight, too.

BIG TEN

-- Illinois moved to within one win of bowl eligibility, taking care of Rutgers by a 38-10 score. The Illini have won three in a row, and they're 4-0 ATS across the past four while the 'under' is 3-0. Are you believing in the Illini now? The Illini are creating plenty of turnovers, and the defense has allowed just 13.0 PPG across the past three. ... Indiana rolled Northwestern at 'The Rock' by a 34-3 score, as the Hoosiers are quietly 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS, while the Wildcats slipped to 1-7 SU and 2-6 ATS. Northwestern has scored just six total points across the past three outings, too. ... Michigan didn't have a hangover after impressive win over the Irish, blasting Maryland by a 38-7 score in College Park. The Wolverines have covered three in a row, and they're 5-1 SU/ATS across the past six. They'll have two weeks to prepare for their rivals from East Lansing.

BIG 12

-- The public was all over Les Miles' Kansas side in their rivalry game against Kansas State. That's never a good side to be on. The Wildcats went to Lawrence and belted the Jayhawks 38-10, carrying over momentum from their win over Oklahoma. Suddenly the Wildcats have won and covered three in a row, and they're 3-0 SU/ATS as a favorite this season. The 'under' is also 4-1 across the past five. ... Baylor limped past West Virginia in a sloppy, low-scoring defensive battle on Thursday night, 17-14. Regardless, the Bears are 8-0 SU, while going 4-4 ATS. ... There were just three games in the Big 12, as Oklahoma St topped TCU, 34-27. The Horned Frogs are 1-3 SU/ATS across the past four outings. The 'over' is 5-1 in the past six for TCU, which makes them a favorite of bettors at the window.

CONFERENCE USA

-- Florida Atlantic won and covered on the road for the second straight weekend, topping Western Kentucky 35-24. The Owls are 4-1 ATS in the past five as a favorite. They have scored 28 or more points in each of the past seven outings. FAU is also 4-1 SU/5-0 ATS in five road games this season while the 'over' is 3-1-1 in those battles. ... Charlotte won at home as underdogs, topping Middle Tennessee by a 34-20 count. The 49ers have won back-to-back games for the first time this season, moving to 4-5 SU/ATS with a winnable road trip to UTEP on the horizon. ... North Texas had one of their most impressive wins of the season, stomping UTEP by a 52-26 count. The cover slapped the brakes on an 0-4 ATS skid. The 'over' has now cashed in five in a row for the Mean Green.

MID-AMERICAN (MAC)

-- Bowling Green welcomed winless Akron and topped the Zips 35-6. Akron was just a four-point underdogs in this one despite the fact they're now 0-9 SU/ATS. In fact, they're the only FBS team yet to cover this season. ... Buffalo went on the road and crushed Eastern Michigan by a 43-14 count. The Bulls inched closer to bowl eligibility at 5-4 SU, winning their third in a row while covering for the fourth straight. They'll travel to Kent State on Nov. 14, as mid-week MAC games behind in the upcoming week. ... Central Michigan punished Northern Illinois 48-10, as the Chippewas fired out to a 21-3 lead after one quarter and never looked back. The total in this game was 49, and there were 48 points on the board at halftime. A scoreless third quarter scared over bettors, but eventually it came through in the fourth. The Chips are now 4-1 SU/ATS in the past five outings, and they're 2-0/ATS as a home dog.

MOUNTAIN WEST

-- San Jose State put a scare into Boise State, leading for a good chunk of the game. However, the Broncos outscored the Spartans 21-8 in the fourth quarter to narrowly escape with a 52-42 victory. The Spartans covered the 16.5-point spread, and they're now 4-0 ATS as a double-digit underdog this season, including two straight-up victories. ... Fresno State headed for the islands and topped Hawaii, 41-38. The Warriors missed a chance to attain bowl eligibility, although they still have three more chances to secure that sixth win. The 'over' is 4-0 in the past four for Hawaii. ... It wasn't pretty, but Nevada posted a 21-10 victory over New Mexico as the 'under' (57) easily cashed. The Wolf Pack have had their issues at times, especially defensively, but they're within one win of bowl eligibility. Overall they're 2-5-1 ATS across the past eight, with the 'under' 3-0 in the past three. ... BYU headed up to Logan and blasted Utah State, 42-14. The Aggies are leaking oil after a 3-1 SU/ATS start, going just 1-3 SU across the past four, and 1-4 ATS over the past five.

PAC-12

-- Some folks saw the Oregon State-Arizona game as a trap for the Wildcats, and they were right. The high-octane Beavers piled up 28 points in the second quarter and never looked back, winning 56-38. The Beavers are now 4-4 SU overall, and 6-1 ATS across the past seven outings. ... Oregon went down to the Coliseum and smashed USC, 56-24. The Ducks have won eight in a row, while hitting the 'over' in three in a row and covering three of the past four. More importantly, the Pac-12's playoff hopes are alive and well. ... UCLA posted a 31-14 victory over Colorado, winning and covering for the third straight outing. They're 4-5 SU, but have a chance at a bowl still, and an outside chance at the Pac-12 Championship game if they can win out. ... Utah went to Washington and won 33-28, keeping their slim playoff hopes alive. The Utes are the team nobody seems to be talking about, but they're a sleeper. They have won and covered five in a row since a seven-point loss at USC on Sept. 20.

SOUTHEASTERN (SEC)

-- Georgia topped Florida by a 24-17 count in the World's Largest Outdoor Cocktail Party in Jacksonville. The 'under' cashed in the top-10 battle, which is now 6-3 in nine games overall for the Gators. The under has cashed in three straight for the Bulldogs, too, and five of the past six overall. ... Auburn won an uninspiring 20-14 game against Mississippi, as the Tigers failed to cover for just the second time in nine tries this season. The 'under' is 3-1 over the past four, as the offense has scored 20 or less in each of those under games. ... South Carolina topped Vanderbilt in a low-scoring 24-7 score, as the Gamecocks suffered several injuries. They still covered, going 2-0 SU/ATS in the past two at home as a double-digit favorite.

SUN BELT

-- Georgia Southern stunned Appalachian State 24-21, more than likely ending their chances at a New Year's Day bowl game unless they can rebound and pick up a win at South Carolina next week. Even then, it might be an uphill climb. After going 5-1 ATS in the first six outings they are 0-2 ATS in the past two. ... Coastal Carolina edged Troy 36-35 as the Chanticleers moved to 4-4 SU/5-3 ATS, needing two games for bowl eligibility.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL BEST BETS

BOSTON COLLEGE - 1 Over Florida St. by 8

Florida State would like to show that the losses the team has picked up on the year was a fluke. The Seminoles have played all over the place on the year with a 4-5 record overall, but when playing in the conference the Seminoles have a 3-4 record. The Seminoles in the last game played ended up losing the game to the Miami Hurricanes 27-10.

This year the Seminoles offense has been able to score at a clip of 27 points a game. The offense has only managed to get 393 yards a game. Defensively the Seminoles are giving up 28.8 points a game, but have allowed 434 yards on the year.

Boston College has managed to get a record that is over the five hundred mark, but only by a single game. The Eagles have a 5-4 record overall, but when playing in the conference the Eagles have ended up with a 3-3 record on the season. The last game out for the Eagles was a 31 point victory over Syracuse in what was a back and forth battle.

The Eagles have ended up getting 34.1 points a game being scored. The offense has managed to get a total of 481 yards on the game. When it comes to playing defense Boston College has allowed 31.4 points a game, but have allowed a total of 483 yards a game.

The Florida State team would enjoy showing that the losses that have mounted on them this season are a fluke, but that will be difficult to do with the way the Eagles are playing on the year. The Seminoles have managed to get a total of only 393 yards a game offense and that is almost 100 less per game than the Eagles. Look for the offensive showing from the Eagles to be the difference in the game here. The Boston College Eagles offense is rolling now, so **grab the points with the Boston College Eagles.**

Texas Tech - 1 Over WEST VIRGINIA by 10

The Texas Tech Red Raiders are set to visit Milan Puskar Stadium in Morgantown, West Virginia for a Big 12 clash against the West Virginia Mountaineers. The Texas Tech Red Raiders come into this matchup with a 3-5 record, and they will be looking to rebound after dropping their recent road game against the Kansas Jayhawks, 37-34. QB Jett Duffey had a big game through the air as he connected on 23 of his 34 pass attempts for 271 yards and 3 TDs. RB Sarodorick Thompson had a solid game on the ground as he ran for 80 yards and a TD on 20 carries.

The Texas Tech Red Raiders struggled on the defensive side of the ball against the Kansas Jayhawks as they allowed them to score 37 points and rack up a total of 527 yards of offense. Junior DB Damarcus Fields led the way for the Texas Tech defense with 9 tackles, 2 pass deflections, and 1 TFL. Senior DB Douglas Coleman III was able to haul in the lone interception of the game which gives him 7 on the season.

The West Virginia Mountaineers come into this matchup with a 3-5 record, and they will be looking to rebound after dropping their recent road game against the Baylor Bears, 17-14. QB Austin Kendall struggled to get much offense generated through the air for West Virginia as he connected on 20 of his 39 pass attempts for 205 yards, 1 TD, and 1 interception. WR George Campbell was able to have a productive game for the Mountaineers as he contributed 83 receiving yards and a TD.

The West Virginia Mountaineers were solid on the defensive side of the ball against the Baylor Bears as they held them to 17 points while forcing 3 turnovers. Sophomore safety Noah Guzman led the way for the West Virginia defense with 11 tackles and 1 fumble recovery. Junior DL Darius Tills was able to get into the Baylor backfield a handful of times as he contributed 10 tackles, 3 TFL, and 3 sacks while Dylan Tonkery pitched in 2 TFL.

The West Virginia Mountaineers have not had success on the offensive side of the ball this season as they rank 112th in points scored, and the lack of a ground attack has been the problem as they are averaging 78.9 yards per game. Texas Tech has looked much better with Jett Duffey under center as he has thrown 9 TDs to 2 interceptions, and he has been supported by Sarodorick Thompson on the ground as he has 550 yards and 8 TDs.

Texas Tech will dare the Mountaineers to try and run the ball, but the difference is their ball-hawking DB Douglas Coleman who has 7 interceptions on the season. We like the Raiders QB Jett Duffey to outduel the Mountaineers QB Austin Kendall. **Take the Texas Tech Red Raiders to win and cover.**

MINNESOTA + 7 Over Penn State by 3

Two undefeated team's square off in a battle for Big Ten championship consideration. The 5th ranked Penn State Nittany Lions take their (8-0) record on the road face the (8-0) and 13th ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers. Both teams are coming off a bye week. The Nittany Lions last game out was a 28-7 win on the road over Michigan State. The Golden Gophers have been steam rolling their opponents over the last 4 weeks. Most recently the Golden Gophers enjoyed a 52-10 home win over Maryland.

In the win over Michigan State, Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford was 18 of 32 for 189 yds, while throwing 4 touchdowns, and 1 interception. Clifford and Pat Freiermuth hooked up for 3 touchdowns in the game. Penn State out gained the Spartans 302 to 265. The Nittany Lions defense came up big in the game, forcing 4 turnovers. The Nittany Lions defense also held Michigan State to just 83 yds rushing.

Minnesota got out to a quick 14-0 lead and never looked back. The Golden Gophers led 28-3 at the half. Minnesota quarterback Tanner Morgan was 12 of 21 for 138 yds, while throwing 2 TD's and 1 INT. Rodney Smith added 103 yds rushing on 17 carries and a touchdown in the win. The Golden Gophers defense was on it's "A" game, holding Maryland to just 210 yds of total offense. Minnesota accumulated 498 yds of total offense. The Golden Gophers held Maryland to just 79 yds rushing.

In Minnesota's last 4 games, the Golden Gophers outscored their opponents by almost 32 points. The Nittany Lions have won 3 games in their last 6 by 7 points or less. We don't think the Golden Gophers are getting the respect they deserve, especially at home. Penn State is 1-7 ATS in their last 8 games following a ATS win. Minnesota is 6-0 ATS in their last 6 conference games. Minnesota is 5-1 ATS vs a team with a winning record. Minnesota will be jacked and can win this game and having a free TD on our side is enough for us to back the Gophers. Like we said, the Golden Gophers could win. **Take the Gophers +7.**

T.C.U. + 2½ Over Baylor by 7

Baylor will look to keep its dream season and playoff hopes alive when the Bears (8-0, 5-0 Big 12) take their No. 11 national ranking into Fort Worth, Texas to take on the TCU Horned Frogs (4-4, 2-3 Big 12) at Amon G. Carter Stadium on Saturday. Baylor is currently in the driver's seat atop the Big 12 standings but with a tough test this week against TCU and showdowns with Texas and Oklahoma looming, each game is of utmost importance.

The Horned Frogs may be the best 4-4 team in the country, holding a win over Texas as well as losses to SMU, Kansas State, and Oklahoma State of seven points or less. The only one-sided loss on the TCU's resume this year is a 49-24 loss at Iowa State. More impressively, however, is how good the Horned Frogs have been at home -- the 10-point win over Texas, a 37-point demolishing of Kansas, a 32-point win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff, and the 3-point loss to SMU, which everyone by now has realized is a pretty good team in their own right.

TCU will need a strong defensive effort -- something that hasn't been there consistently this year. The Horned Frogs rank 59th in FBS allowing 26.1 points per game but has allowed a much-inflated 33.5 points per game over the last four weeks. With Baylor ranked No. 24 in FBS scoring 36.1 points per game, it will be near impossible for TCU to hang with the Bears without a huge defensive effort.

Baylor remains undefeated but has been challenged throughout the season. After two blowout wins to start the season, The Bears held on to beat Rice 21-13 and edged Iowa State 23-21. An impressive 19-point win at Kansas State was followed by a two-overtime thriller over Texas Tech before another impressive 18-point road win at Oklahoma State. Baylor finally returned home last week and just edged West Virginia 17-14.

The Bears will look to pass the ball with junior quarterback Charlie Brewer leading the way. Brewer has thrown for 2,143 yards with 14 touchdowns and just three interceptions this year. Top receiver Denzel Mims is averaging 16.3 yards per reception catching 38 passes for 618 yards and six touchdowns.

Neither team has been consistent one way or another against the spread or with the total. TCU is 3-5 against the spread this year while Baylor is even at 4-4. Baylor has hit the over and under four times each this year while five of TCU's games have gone over, while three have hit the under. But despite the trends, that total of 51.5 just seems too low. These are two teams in the top third of the FBS in scoring, and while Baylor's defense is statistically elite, it is still allowing nearly 20 points per game, with more against the top offenses it has faced. It doesn't seem like a longshot that the Frogs put up 31 points this week. **Take the over if you want an additional play, but for the purposes of this newsletter, we will back TCU to win and defend their turf.**

L.S.U. + 6½ Over ALABAMA by 3

An SEC clash pairs the top two ranked team's in the country. The top ranked LSU Tigers (8-0) travel to Tuscaloosa, AL to face the Alabama Crimson Tide (8-0). Both teams are coming off bye weeks. LSU enjoyed a win over Auburn 23-20 last time out. Alabama most recently beat Arkansas 48-7.

In the win over Auburn, LSU quarterback Joe Burrow was 32 of 41 for 321 yds and touchdown. Burrow also threw one interception in the game, while also adding a rushing touchdown. LSU running back Clyde Edwards-Helaire had a dominating game out of the backfield, rushing for 136 yds on 26 carries and a score. LSU out gained Auburn in the game, 508 to 287. The Tigers rushed for a total of 187 yds on 46 attempts.

Crimson Tide was guided by quarterback Mac Jones. Jones was 18 of 22 for 235 yds and three for 3 touchdowns. Najee Harris contributed 86 yds rushing on 13 carries and 2 touchdowns. Jerry Jeudy added 7 receptions for 103 yds and 2 touchdowns in the blowout victory. Alabama did not allow a touchdown until the 4th quarter. The Crimson Tide forced 4 Arkansas turnovers. Alabama accumulated 459 total yds of offense.

Alabama has dominated the head to head series recently. The Crimson Tide have won 8 of the last 10 meetings. We think 6½ points is a big underdog spread for the highest ranked team in the country. LSU is 1-5 ATS in the last 6 meetings against Alabama, but LSU is 5-0 ATS in their last 5 road games. LSU is also 13-3 ATS in their last 16 road games vs a team with a winning home record. Alabama is 0-5 ATS in their last 5 home games vs a team with a winning road record.

Burrow has done a great job in leading this Tigers offense all year and while LSU has not been profitable in covering the spread in recent meetings against the Tide, we believe this is the year. The Tigers have played well on the road, especially against the spread. There will be more points put up than expected as **L.S.U. wins the tussle in Tuscaloosa.**

NFL PICKS WENT 1-3 LAST WEEK DROPPING US DOWN TO 20-16 56% SO FAR THIS SEASON

NFL Football Recap

-- The Cleveland Browns (-4) entered the season with a ton of hype, centering around the addition of WR Odell Beckham, while QB Baker Mayfield is frequently seen on commercials, while taking on critics at every turn. There is a lot of attention surrounding the Browns, and a lot of noise, but very few wins on the actual playing field. The Denver Broncos turned to QB Brandon Allen for his first NFL start with QB Joe Flacco reportedly dealing with a neck injury which will keep him out four to six weeks. It looked like a stroke of luck for a Cleveland team desperately in need of some noise on the field. Oh ya, this was also our Private Gold pick which went down very quickly. They didn't get it. It was more of the same...silly penalties and a lack of results in the red zone. Hey, at least they didn't turn the ball over, and won that battle 1-0.

Anyway, the Browns have now dropped four in a row, and they're 0-4 ATS during the span since opening 2-2 SU/ATS. The defense hasn't been up to snuff, allowing 20 or more points in six straight games, and 24 or more in each of the past five. They're now 0-3 SU/ATS on the road, posting just 11.7 PPG and 27.3 PPG allowed during that three-game span on the road.

-- The Houston Texans (+1) made their first-ever trip to London in Week 9. They might ask the NFL to make the trip more often, as they throttled the Jacksonville Jaguars by a 26-3 victory at Wembley Stadium, moving to 6-3 SU overall, including 2-0 SU against the Jags. No DE J.J. Watt? No problem. The Texans have posted 23 or more points in each of their past five games, but they snapped a two-game mini-skid against the number. The Jags saw their record slip to 4-5 SU, but they're still a solid 5-3 ATS across the past eight games.

-- The highest total on the board was the Detroit Lions-Oakland Raiders (51.5), and while things settled down a bit in the third quarter, both QBs Matthew Stafford and Derek Carr were tossing the pill around early and often. Both teams were poor against the pass coming in, and it showed frequently during the game. The second-highest total on the board was also a high-scoring affair.

The Tampa Bay Buccaneers-Seattle Seahawks (51) battle was a seesaw affair with plenty of offense. There were more than 11 points in each quarter, and the game was tied 34-34 before heading to overtime where Seattle ended up with the win.

The other game with a closing total at or over 50 was the Green Bay Packers-Los Angeles Chargers (50) game, which closed at exactly 50. The Pack offense never got on track, at least until a late, meaningless touchdown in the fourth quarter, as the Chargers defense finally showed up.

-- On the flip side, the lowest total on the board was the Washington Redskins-Buffalo Bills (37) game. Buffalo's offense did their part, posting 24 points, but the defense held the 'Skins and rookie QB Dwayne Haskins to just nine points in his first NFL start. The Redskins have totaled nine or fewer points in five of the past six games, averaging 7.5 PPG. Needless to say, the 'under' is a perfect 6-0 for the 'Skins during that span.

The Cleveland Browns-Denver Broncos (39) game was the second-lowest on the big board, mainly due to the presence of Allen under center, and Denver's re-emerging defense. They scored 24, and the total inched over the mark with a late Cleveland touchdown. The only other game with a total under 40 was Indianapolis Colts-Pittsburgh Steelers (39.5). The Colts lost QB Jacoby Brissett early in the game to a knee injury, but veteran backup QB Brian Hoyer more than held his own, tossing three touchdowns. The Colts fell 26-24, but the game went well 'over'.

-- The 'over' hit in all three primetime games of Week 9, with the Monday Night Football contest between the Dallas Cowboys-New York Giants (48) cashing with six seconds remaining thanks to a fumble by QB Daniel Jones and a scoop and score. The 'over' is just 9-19 (32.1%) during the 2019 primetime schedule, a stark change from previous seasons when the games under the lights were high-scoring affairs. The 'under' was a perfect 8-0 for Sunday Night Football this season, but the New England Patriots-Baltimore Ravens (44.5) game went over in the SNF game for the second consecutive weekend.

Injury Report

-- Colts QB Jacoby Brissett (knee) is likely to be sidelined for some game time due to what is believed to be a sprained medial collateral ligament.

-- Vikings WR Adam Thielen (hamstring) aggravated his hamstring injury and was forced back to the sidelines.

Looking Ahead - Divisional Battles Week

-- The Chargers and Raiders square off on Thursday night in what is expected to be the final primetime game at 'The Black Hole' before they move to Las Vegas. The Bolts are 4-0 ATS in their past four appearances on Thursday, and they're 9-2-1 ATS in the past 12 games on the road while going 8-1 ATS in the past nine in the month of November. That includes their 26-11 win over the Packers in Week 9. The Raiders are 6-1 ATS in their past seven at home, however, including their Week 9 win against the Lions. The Bolts might be sad to see the Raiders leaving Oakland, as they're 4-0 ATS in their past four trips to the East Bay. So all the trends point to Rivers Chargers. So is the trend your friend? Better get DJ's Thursday Night Guaranteed NFL pick before pulling the trigger.

-- The Ravens are coming off an emotional win against the previously unbeaten Patriots, now they have to face the winless Bengals. Will there be a dropoff in intensity and focus? What the heck, they're human right? The Bengals are starting QB Ryan Finley, using the bye week to prep him for his first NFL start. Remember what happened last week when the Broncos had a similar situation and 1st time starter Allen dumped the Browns. The Ravens are 0-7 ATS in their past seven inside the division, and 0-6 ATS in the past six against losing teams. While the Bengals are 1-8 ATS in their past nine home games, they have covered eight of the past 11 against divisional foes. Baltimore hasn't covered in four straight meetings, and they're 4-10 ATS in the past 14 trips to Paul Brown Stadium. Of course, the Bengals haven't been this bad before. Does anyone really have the guts to back the Bengals?

-- The Lions and Bears square off in Chicago in a tale of two teams. The Lions are a pass-happy offense which cannot stop anyone defensively. The Bears are a defensive-minded side who cannot pass against anyone. Some might find it curious then that the Bears opened as three-point favorites. Well, Chicago is 4-1-1 ATS in the past six meetings, and 3-1-1 ATS in the past five home meetings with the Lions. The 'under' is also 5-2 in the past seven at Soldier Field between these combatants. The question here is can the Bears D play up to expectations?

-- The lowly Falcons are back from their bye week, and they're facing a Saints team which is also coming off a rest. Atlanta is 5-2 ATS in the past seven following a bye, but just 5-17 ATS in the past 22 on the road and 1-5 ATS in the past six games overall. New Orleans has covered six in a row, and they're 10-2 ATS in the past 12 following a bye week while cashing in 17 of the past 25 inside the division while going 6-2 ATS in the past eight against losing teams. The Falcons are 1-4 ATS in the past five meetings, and 2-6 ATS in the past eight trips to NOLA. All trends point to the Saints, but will the Falcons bye week prove to be just what the doctor ordered?

-- The fifth and final divisional battle will take place on Monday in a highly anticipated game between the Seahawks and unbeaten 49ers, the last unbeaten in the NFL. How many people had that prediction? Not us for sure. The Seahawks are 8-2 ATS in the past 10 on the road, while going 9-4-1 ATS in the past 14 meetings on Monday Night Football. The 49ers blasted the Browns earlier this season on MNF, and they're 27-7 ATS in their past 34 appearances on MNF. The Seahawks are 11-3-1 ATS in the past 15 in this series, and 5-2 ATS in the past seven trips to San Francisco, but these 49ers are a completely different animal, and it may be a good idea to ignore those trends. Or maybe not? The thing to do here is just to buy DJ's MNF pick rather than trying to figure this game out.

PRO FOOTBALL BEST BETS

Buffalo + 3 Over CLEVELAND by 6

Cleveland, OH pairs two teams together that are going in opposite directions. The Buffalo Bills enter the game with a record of (6-2). The Bills enjoyed a 24-9 win over the Washington Redskins in their last game. The Cleveland Browns are (2-6) on the season and are coming off a loss on to the road to the Denver Broncos, 24-19.

The Bills got out to an early lead, thanks to a 6 yard touchdown reception from Cole Beasley from Josh Allen. Allen was 14 of 20 on the day for 160 yds and a touchdown. Allen also added a rushing touchdown in the game. Bills running back Devin Singletary rushed for 95 yds on 20 carries and a score. The Bills defense held the Redskins to just 116 passing yds. The Bills out gained the Redskins 268 to 243. The Bills covered the spread in this game.

The Brown dropped another game and continue to under perform since the season started. Browns quarterback Baker Mayfield was 27 of 42 for 273 yds and a touchdown. Nick Chubb ran for 65 yds on 20 carries. Jarvis Landry added his first receiving touchdown of the season. The Browns out gained the Broncos in total offense, 351 to 302. The Browns weren't able to find the end zone once they crossed midfield all that often. Brown were kept in the game thanks to kicker Austin Seibert. Seibert was 4 of 4 on field goals with a long of 39 yds.

Bills are 4-0 ATS in their last 4 road games. Bills are 7-3 ATS in their last 10 games overall. Browns are 9-23 ATS in their last 32 home games. Browns are 0-6 ATS in their last 6 games on grass.

The Browns will be going up against the 3rd ranked passing defense in the league and the 5th ranked defense in allowing the fewest points. The Cleveland defense isn't stellar by any means, the Browns rank 29th in rushing yds allowed. This plays into the rushing attack of Singletary and Allen. The Browns will struggle in this one to contain Josh Allen. The Bills defense should be able to contain a Browns offense that has been sputtering. The Bills offense has had its issues this season as well, only averaging 19 points per game. In a game where points will be tough to produce, Josh Allen and **the Bills will do just enough offensively to win this one straight up.**

TAMPA BAY - 4 Over ARIZONA by 10

The Arizona Cardinals travel to the state of Florida this weekend for a game against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In their last game, the Cardinals were defeated by the San Francisco 49ers by the score of 28-25 in what was a much closer game than what many fans had expected. Arizona quarterback Kyler Murray continued what has been a solid rookie year as he completed 17 of 24 passes for 241 yards and 2 touchdowns. Murray also ran 5 times for 34 yards. Newly acquired Kenyan Drake carried the ball 15 times in route to rushing for 110 yards and scoring a touchdown in his first game with Arizona. Keesean Johnson caught one of Murray's touchdown passes and as he caught 2 passes for 22 yards on the day. Wide receiver Andy Isabella led the Cardinals in receiving yards on the day, although he only caught 1 pass, it was good enough for 88 yards and a touchdown.

On the year the Cardinals are 3-5-1 but will be looking to get closer to the .500 mark after a game against Tampa Bay. Kyler Murray has lived up to his dual threat potential that he showed at Oklahoma as he has thrown the ball well this season for 2,229 yards, 9 touchdowns and 4 interceptions. Murray is also the Cardinals leading rusher and has ran 56 times for 313 yards and 2 touchdowns on the season. The ageless wonder Larry Fitzgerald has been Arizona's lead receiver once again this season as he has caught 42 passes for 485 yards and 2 touchdowns.

The Tampa Bay Buccaneers welcome the Arizona Cardinals to town after returning from Seattle where they were defeated by the Seahawks last Sunday by the score of 40-34 in overtime. Jameis Winston has one of his best games on the season under center for the Bucs and to the surprise of many, didn't throw an interception. On the day Winston completed 29 of 44 passes for 335 yards and 2 touchdowns. Tampa Bay wide receiver Mike Evans caught 12 passes for 180 yards and a touchdown. Ronald Jones II has one of his most productive games out of the backfield for the Bucs and led the team in rushing, carrying the ball 18 times for 67 yards and a touchdown.

Winston has thrown for 2,407 yards, 16 TD's and 12 picks. Ronald Jones II has been Tampa Bay's leading rusher and has carried the ball 92 times for 381 yards and 3 touchdowns. Wide receiver Mike Evans has benefited most from Tampa Bay's pass heavy offense and has 50 receptions for 812 yards and 7 touchdowns.

What will be interesting to see is how Kyler Murray gets his yards on the ground against a team like Tampa Bay who is allowing just 78.1 yards per game on the ground, if he is unable to get going, it will all be up to his throwing abilities. Tampa Bay has averaged 300.9 yards per game through the air this season while Arizona has allowed 247.7 passing yards per game. Bucs will have enough defense to win and cover against the banged up Cards.

INDIANAPOLIS - 10 Over Miami by 17

The Dolphins beat the NY Jets in their last game by the score of 26-18 to notch their first win of the season. Ryan Fitzpatrick, who started the season as the Dolphins starting QB only to lose it and gain it back again is Miami's leading passer and has thrown for 1,195 yards, 8 touchdowns and 7 interceptions. Preston Williams has been the Dolphins lead receiver on the year, catching 32 passes for 428 yards and 3 TD's. Mark Walton is Miami's leading rusher and has carried the ball 53 times this season for 201 and no touchdowns.

The Indianapolis Colts enter Sunday's game coming off of a 26-24 loss to the Pittsburgh Steelers which Adam Vinatieri missed a late field goal that would have given the Colts the lead. Colts quarterback Jacoby Brissett exited the game with an injury after going 4 of 5 for 59 yards. After Brissett could no longer continue, Brian Hoyer took over under center for Indianapolis and completed 17 of 26 passes for 3 touchdowns and an interception which was returned for a touchdown. Three different Colts receivers caught passes on the day as Zach Pascal, Jack Doyle and Chester Rogers were all on the end of Hoyer's passes that found the end zone. Pascal was also the Colts lead receiver on the day as he caught 5 passes for 76 yards to go along with his score. Marlon Mack had an okay day on the ground as he rushed 21 times for 89 yards but didn't find the end zone. QB Jacoby Brissett has stepped in and been great this year for the Colts, throwing for 1,649 yards, 14 touchdowns and just 3 interceptions. It still remains to be seen if Brissett will be back in action this Sunday or if Hoyer will get a start for the Colts. T.Y. Hilton who missed last Sunday's game against the Steelers has been the Colts leading receiver and has caught 32 passes for 360 yards and 5 touchdowns on the season. Marlon Mack leads the Colts in rushing and has carried the ball 159 times for 679 yards and 3 touchdowns on the year.

The Dolphins have scored 12.9 points per game on the season, while they have allowed 32 points per game. The Colts have scored 22.8 points per game this season, while allowing 22.1 points per game. There is a chance that the Colts will have to turn to Hoyer again this weekend and usually, if a team is playing with their back up quarterback and without their top two receivers as the Colts are, usually we would pick against them but unfortunately for Dolphins fans, we're not. Even with all of their backups in the Colts win this one in the dome with a Mack truck of a runner dominating the game. Colts jump on the Dolphins early and never look back. **Colts cover.**

LA Rams - 4 Over PITTSBURGH by 13

The Los Angeles Rams head to Pittsburgh, PA this weekend for a match up with the Steelers. In their last game, the Rams defeated the still winless Cincinnati Bengals in London by the score of 24-10. Rams quarterback Jared Goff had a field day against the Bengals defense and completed 17 of 31 passes for 372 yards and 2 touchdowns. One of Goff's touchdown passes was caught by LA's lead receiver on the day, Cooper Kupp who caught 7 passes for 220 yards and 1 touchdown. Darrell Henderson Jr. was the Rams leading rusher on the day as he carried the ball 11 times for 49 yards. Meanwhile, running back Todd Gurley II ran 11 times for 44 yards and a touchdown. On the year the Rams are 5-3 and currently sit in 3rd place in the stacked NFC West. Rams quarterback Jared Goff has thrown for 2,367 yards, 11 touchdowns and 7 interceptions and isn't having the type of year he would have hoped for. Cooper Kupp is the Rams leading receiver as he has caught 58 passes for 792 yards and 5 touchdowns on the season. LA is led in rushing by running back Todd Gurley II who as carried the ball 92 times for 355 yards and 6 touchdowns so far this year. Jaylen Samuels was the Steelers lead receiver as he caught 13 passes for 73 yards. Rudolph's touchdown pass was caught by Vance McDonald who caught 5 passes for 30 yards to go along with his touchdown. Trey Edmunds was the lead rusher for the Steelers in the game as he had 12 carries for 73 yards on the day. With the win, the Steelers are now 4-4 on the season which is good enough for 2nd place in the AFC North Division. Mason Rudolph has thrown for 1,088 yards, 10 TD's and 4 interceptions. The Rams are scoring 26.8 points per game while allowing 21.8 points per game. Meanwhile, the Steelers are scoring 22 points per game and allowing 21.1 points per game. Although the defensive numbers are close the Rams are averaging almost 5 more points per game than the Steelers. Also, with James Conner being out, it makes Mason Rudolph become more one dimensional if he doesn't have Conner and his strong running game to lean on.
