LSU UPSETS ALABAMA GOPHERS DUMP LIONS WE CRUSHED DA BOOKS NOW IT'S MICHIGAN vs MICH ST

College Football Recap

SOUTHEASTERN (SEC)

-- Of course, the most highly-anticipated game of the season was LSU-Alabama. A lot of talk about Minnesota was "they haven't played anybody", but really, who has 'Bama played? Duke? New Mexico State? Ole Miss? A&M? None of the teams they played previously were in the rankings this week. LSU was ranked No. 2 in the College Playoff rankings, and they opened a 33-13 lead at halftime before hanging on for the 46-41 victory in Tuscaloosa. Alabama is 4-5 ATS this season, and they have yet to cover in consecutive games this season. That's why our Marquee Pick last week was the LSU Tigers and they ripped the tide ..Arkansas ended up closely as short 'dogs at home against a Conference USA team, Western Kentucky. It gets worse. The Hogs were thrashed by the Hilltoppers by a 45-19 score, and the QB for WKU was a former Arkansas signal caller. It doesn't appear head coach Chad Morris is going to be employed much longer in Fayetteville, if he even lasts the week. ... Tennessee went up to Kentucky and it seemed like old times. They rallied for a 17-13 win after falling behind 13-0 after one quarter, and the Vols have now won three in a row and moved within one game of bowl eligibility. More importantly they're 5-0 ATS across the past five after going 1-4 ATS to start.

AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE (AAC)

-- Cincinnati entered the weekend as the highest ranked team among the Group of Five candidates, and they did nothing to hurt their chances with a 48-3 whitewashing of Connecticut. The Bearcats covered the 34-point number, their first cover outings after opening the season 5-1 ATS. ... SMU was involved in another shootout, as they held off East Carolina by a 59-51 count in Dallas. The 'over' is now 9-0-1 in 10 games for the Mustangs this season. After opening the season 5-0 ATS, they're just 1-4 ATS across the past five, including non-covers in the past three. ... Tulsa entered Friday's game against UCF with nothing to play for but pride, as they have been eliminated from bowl contention. They showed tremendous pride in dealing the Golden Knights a 34-31 loss. While the Golden Hurricane entered on a five-game losing streak, they're now 3-1 ATS across the four outings. Looks like there will be no national championship claims this season in Orlando.

ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE (ACC)

-- To our delight, Miami dumped Louisville by a 52-27 score, perhaps their most impressive showing of the season. (We released this winner free, as a Veterans Day weekend bonus.) The Hurricanes have won and covered a season-best three in a row after opening 3-4 SU/ATS, and they're now bowl eligible. ... Duke opened the season with a 4-2 SU/ATS mark, but they're on a three-game skid after falling at home to Notre Dame by a 38-7 count. They're also 0-3 ATS during the skid, and their offense has dried up. They're averaging just 12.7 PPG across the past three after opening with 40.4 PPG in a five-game span from Sept. 7-Oct. 12. ... Virginia held off Georgia Tech by a 33-28 score, as the Cavaliers moved to 7-3 SU. However, after opening 2-0 ATS, they're just 2-5-1 ATS across the past eight. The Yellow Jackets opened 0-6 ATS, but they're not quitting down the stretch, going 2-1 ATS across the past three. They're a friend to total bettors, too, as the 'over' is 4-1 in the past five contests. ... N.C. State has given Clemson some trouble in the past, including a straight-up victory at Carter-Finley Stadium back on Nov. 19, 2011. The Pack won 37-13 that night as 7 1/2-point underdogs. There was no such trouble on Saturday. The Tigers mowed down the Pack 55-10 in chilly Raleigh. Remember when everyone was writing off the Tigers after their near-miss at UNC? Yeah, they're not going anywhere anytime soon. You can expect a jump in the rankings for the Tigers.

BIG TEN

-- Illinois looked like the same old Illini on Saturday - for three quarters. They entered the fourth quarter down 31-10 at Michigan State, but this installment of the Illini is different. They really do fight. They outscored Sparty 27-3 in the final quarter, earning bowl eligibility in style with a 37-34 win. Remember all of those calls for Lovie Smith's job the past couple of seasons. He is safe now, and the calls are for Mark Dantonio's job in East Lansing these days. ... The big news in the Big Ten was the eligibility issue and suspension of DE Chase Young, the Heisman Trophy candidate. He reportedly took a small loan from a close family friend to fly his girlfriend out to the Rose Bowl to see him play. He paid the loan back in the spring. Sounds harmless enough, but this is the archaic and selective punishing NCAA we're talking about here. Was Ohio State distracted? Nah. They embarrassed Maryland by a 73-14 score, their second time hitting the 70-point plateau this season. They were ranked No. 1 in the first official College Football Playoff rankings released this past Tuesday, but may slip due to LSU's win over Alabama in the SEC. ... Another playoff hopeful likely to tumble is Penn State, as they were ranked No. 4. They went to Minnesota, a team which received knocks because they "haven't played anybody", and lost to the Golden Gophers by a 31-26 score in an entertaining game. P.J. Fleck's rowed the boat at Western Michigan, and now he's rowing it in the Twin Cities. The Gophers are 6-0 ATS across the past six.

BIG 12

-- Iowa State gave Oklahoma all they could handle in a 42-41 loss in Norman. Inside the final minute HC Matt Campbell elected to go for two and the win after a late touchdown, but the attempt was picked off to avert disaster for the Sooners. The Cyclones have lost to both Oklahoma schools in the past two games, and they're still not yet eligible for a bowl at 5-4 SU with three to play. ... Texas held off Kansas State by a 27-24 score, although the Wildcats grabbed the cover. It was a rather curious line with K-State catching more than a touchdown against the skidding Longhorns. The Wildcats have covered four in a row, and the 'under' is 5-1 across their past six, as they have been a friend to bettors. Overall they're 7-2 ATS in nine outings. ... Baylor won a crazy game in TCU, 29-23 in overtime. This was not just a bad beat, but perhaps the worst one of the 2019 season (ya one of our losses in our Gridiron Gold Sheet last week .. ugh). The Bears improved to 9-0 SU, but they're just 5-4 ATS, while the 'over' is 3-1 across the past four. The over is 6-1 in TCU's past seven, too, although it probably shouldn't have hit.

CONFERENCE USA

-- Florida Atlantic won the Shula Bowl, which is the annual meeting with South Florida rival Florida International. The Owls won 37-7, topping FIU for the 13th time in 17 meetings. More importantly to bettors, Lane Kiffin's Owls are 7-3 SU heading into a bye, temporarily in sole possession of first place in the East Division of C-USA. They're 7-1 SU across the past eight, and 5-1 ATS over the past six. They're still the only team to cover the spread against No. 1 Ohio State, too, and the only team to score more than twice against the Buckeyes in a game this season. ... UAB is suddenly in freefall, as they were blasted 37-2 by Southern Miss. The Blazers opened 6-1 SU/5-2 ATS, but they're 0-2 SU/ATS over the past two with the 'under' hitting in both since they're averaging 4.5 PPG during the skid. ... Texas-San Antonio stole one at Old Dominion, winning 24-23. The Roadrunners are now 3-0 ATS and they have hit the 'over' in three straight, too. ... Louisiana Tech spanked North Texas, 52-17, as the Mean Green slipped to 4-6 SU, needing to win both of their final games to become bowl eligible. They're just 1-5 ATS in the past six, too.

MID-AMERICAN (MAC)

-- All three mid-week MAC games saw the underdog go 3-0 ATS, with Miami-Ohio winning outright at Ohio, 24-21. The 'over' covered in the pair of Tuesday battles, too, while Wednesday's Miami-Ohio contest hit the under thanks to a scoreless first quarter. ... If you had an 'under' ticket in the Ball State-Western Michigan game, you elected to receive your bad beat a few days early.

MOUNTAIN WEST

-- There were four games in the Mountain West, and all four were decided by four or fewer points, with the Wyoming-Boise State game going to overtime. The Cowboys were using a backup quarterback, as were the Broncos, so that explained the low-scoring affair. Even overtime wasn't enough to bail out 'over' bettors in this one. ... Our Saturday Night Bailout pick Nevada pulled off a surprising 17-13 road win against San Diego State, who, honestly, have been living rather dangerously. The Aztecs slipped to 1-3 ATS as a double-digit favorite, and perhaps a 17-point spread was a gift to bettors since the Aztecs have failed to score more than 27 points in every game except at New Mexico State back on Sept. 14. The 'under' is 3-0 in the past three, and 8-1 in their nine games overall. For the Wolf Pack, they attained bowl eligibility with the win, and they're now 6-4 SU while winning outright twice as double-digit 'dogs this season. ... San Jose State headed to the islands and lost an entertaining 42-40 game at Hawaii. The Spartans have dropped two in a row despite averaging 41.0 PPG, and they're 3-0 ATS in the past three, while going 6-1-1 ATS in the past eight overall.

PAC-12

-- There were just four total games in the Pac-12, with three games on Saturday. USC-Arizona State was an entertaining battle, as the Trojans won 31-26 in Tempe, just narrowly missing a 5.5-point cover. After opening 0-3 SU/1-2 ATS on the road, the Trojans are 2-0 SU/0-1-1 ATS in the past two away from home. The 'over' is also 3-0 in the past three games following a 5-0 'under' run for the Men of Troy. ... Colorado snapped a five-game losing skid, rallying for a gutsy 17-13 win over Stanford. The Buffaloes still need to win their final two for bowl eligibility, and they have Washington and Utah remaining. Good luck with that! Speaking of Washington, they won 19-7 on Friday night against Oregon State, nearly shutting them out. In fact, the defense did not allow any points, as the Beavers scored their only TD on a pick-six.

SUN BELT

-- South Carolina paid Appalachian State to come to Columbia to play. They didn't know they'd be getting an angry Mountaineers side after losing at home to Georgia Southern last week. App State pulled off a road win for the second time against a Power 5 team, just the seventh team to do that since 2001. ... Speaking of Southern, they failed to cover over the momentum from their big win. They went to Troy and were handled, 49-28 as field-goal favorites. The Eagles slipped to 5-4 SU, and still need a win to attain bowl eligibility. The 'over' is 5-2 across the past seven outings. ... Georgia State was another field-goal favorite on the road to struggle, falling at Louisiana-Monroe by a 45-31 count, snapping a four-game winning streak. It was a rare non-cover for the Panthers, too, as they entered 5-1-2 ATS in the first eight outings.

Bad Beats

-- Perhaps the most raw beat of the season happened on the Baylor-TCU total. If you had an 'under' (48) ticket, you were on the right side. In fact, there were no touchdowns at all in regulation. The game went to overtime, and should have still cashed the under with just 18 total points on the board. However, the teams exchanged touchdowns in the first overtime, they extended touchdowns in the second OT, too, and you were already done with 46 on the board, regardless of what happened in triple. Baylor ended up winning 29-23, adding salt to the wound of anyone hold a TCU side ticket (Ya that was us last week). The Horned Frogs probably should have covered in regulation, 9-6, but the Bears hit a clutch 51-yard field goal with :36 left to force OT. It figures right!

-- As mentioned, the mid-week MAC game between Ball State and Western Michigan was a tough pill to swallow for 'under' bettors. The total was 64.5, and entering the fourth there were just 38 points on the board. Western Michigan took a 28-24 lead with 5:21 to go, and you were still in good shape. Ball State replied quickly re-taking a 31-28 lead with 3:24 to go. With just 1:05 remaining in regulation, the Broncos struck for a touchdown to win 35-31, flipping the total to 'over'.

-- The Florida State-Boston College (64.5) game was a rough one for 'under' bettors, too. Aren't they all? BC tied it up 24-24 with 2:33 to go. FSU answered with a 60-yard touchdown to re-take the lead, 31-24. This game did NOT go to overtime, yet under bettors still lost. Yes, a touchdown was scored by FSU with 1:03 to go, and then BC had a touchdown with just 14 seconds left to flip the total over. There were 41 points on the board with 2:34 to play. There were 28 points scored in the final 2:33. Ouch. That smarts!

COLLEGE FOOTBALL BEST BETS

Buffalo - 3 Over KENT ST. by 12

Buffalo (5-4, 3-2 MAC) is a team still looking to earn a spot in the Mid-American Conference championship game but will likely need to win out and get some help to do so. The next team trying to stop the Bulls' championship run will be the Kent State (3-6, 2-3 MAC) when the **Golden Flashes host Buffalo at Dix Stadium on Thursday night.**

Buffalo sits just one game behind MAC East Division leaders Miami (Ohio) and must win out to have a chance. The Bulls have been great after losing 34-20 to Miami (Ohio) and Ohio in overtime, 21-20. Buffalo knocked off Akron 21-0 before big wins over C Michigan 43-20 and E Michigan 43-14. While the OT loss to Ohio hurt, it still holds an impressive 38-22 win over Temple. Much of Buffalo's offensive success has come since Kyle Vantrease took over as starting QB after Matt Myers was injured. Vantrease passed for 179 yards and two touchdowns in the win over C. Michigan and 208 yards and a touchdown against E. Michigan. But the Bulls will always look to run first and will count on Jaret Patterson to get that job done. Patterson averages 5.2 yards per carry to go along with seven TD's. Sophomore Kevin Marks has added 730 yards and five touchdowns on the ground this year. That rushing attack spells trouble for Kent State. The Golden Flashes rank 127th out of 130 FBS teams in rushing defense, allowing 254.9 yards per game. Kent State has lost three in a row and four out of five and has given up big rushing yards along the way. Toledo used 289 yards on the ground on the way to a 35-33 win over Kent State, and Miami (Ohio) put up an identical 289 yards rushing in its 23-16 win over the Flashes.

Kent State is a pass-first team and has only had two 100-yard rushers all season. Junior Dustin Crum has been impressive at quarterback this season throwing for 1,602 yards on 67.9 percent completions and 13 touchdowns against just one interception. To show how much Kent State will look to pass first, Crum is also the team's leading rusher with 414 yards. Sophomore Isaiah McKoy leads a stable of impressive receivers with 525 yards receiving and four touchdowns.

While Buffalo's strength of rushing the ball falls into Kent State's weakness defensively, the Golden Flashes' strength of passing the ball is also a strength for the Bulls' defense. Buffalo ranks No. 41 in FBS allowing just 208.8 yards passing per game. That information alone makes this pick fairly simple. The scenario is easy to imagine: Buffalo controls the ball on the ground and Kent State's defense spends 40 minutes on the field, tiring in the end as the Bulls pull away. Take Buffalo for a two-touchdown win as it tries to keep its conference title game hopes alive.

Projected Score: Buffalo 33, Kent St. 21

Fresno St. + 3 & 44½ Over S DIEGO ST by 7 & Under by 11½

Two teams with all to play for coming off of disappointing losses face off Friday when the Fresno State Bulldogs (4-5, 2-3 MWC) head to SDCCU Stadium to take on the San Diego State Aztecs (7-2, 4-2 MWC) in Mountain West Conference West Division action. Despite the Bulldogs' 37-35 loss to Utah State and the Aztecs' 17-13 loss to Nevada on Saturday, both still have a solid shot of reaching the MWC championship game. Both teams would have looked better heading into this week with wins, but now the Aztecs are 4-2 in conference play with Hawaii and Nevada one game back at 3-3 and Fresno State sitting at 2-3. A Fresno State win would put four teams on three losses with the Aztecs still needing to go to the islands to face Hawaii where the Rainbow Warriors are so good.

So this game means everything to both teams and their chances of reaching a title game.

Fresno State has been all over the place this season with impressive losses such as an eight-point loss to USC and a two-overtime three-point loss to Minnesota that is currently ranked No. 7 in the AP poll and still undefeated on the season. But it also lost by 19 to Air Force and 10 points to Colorado State, so it's difficult to know what to expect from the Bulldogs on any given week. In the past two weeks, Fresno State got out to a big lead at Hawaii, allowed the Rainbow Warriors to come back and tie the game late before kicking a game-winning field goal as time expired, followed by leading Utah State late and allowing a game-winning field goal as time expired to the Aggies.

In a conference that loves offense, the Bulldogs rank No. 4 in the MWC and 30th in FBS averaging 34.3 points per game led by junior Ronnie Rivers. Rivers is seventh in the MWC in rushing averaging 72.8 yards per game but is second in the conference in scoring with 13 touchdowns on the season. Senior Jorge Reyna who is 42nd in FBS with 234.0 passing yards per game with 11 passing touchdowns and six interceptions. Nine different receivers have caught more than 100 yards of receiving yards led by Zane Pope's 38 receptions and 397 yards.

This matchup should be an interesting one in that San Diego State's offense struggles to score with just 20.8 points per game (11th in MWC and 112th in FBS) but is the No. 1 defense in the MWC allowing just 14.4 points per game (8th FBS). San Diego State simply doesn't have much to talk about offensively and simply haven't been very good at home this year. This is the type of game that the Bulldogs have thrived in as a road underdog, going 20-14 ATS. San Diego St is a only 1-8 ATS as a home fav the past two years. But not that they allowed less than 16 ppg at home this year. Therefore, we see the Aztecs defense playing a fired up and good game, but their offense will not be able to match the Bulldog scores.

Double Play Here: Go with Fresno State plus 3 points and take Under 44½ in San Diego on Friday night.

Michigan - 13 Over Michigan St. by 3

The Michigan State Spartans get to stay in the state of Michigan against their state rival, the #14 Michigan Wolverines. In their last game, Michigan St lost to Illinois 37-34 in a game that saw Michigan St get outscored 27-3 in the 4th quarter. Michigan St quarterback Brian Lewerke completed 19 of 36 passing attempts for a TD and 3 picks while also rushing 11 times for 96 yards and a TD. Spartans running back Elijah Day was the leading rusher as he ran 28 times for 170 yards and 2 touchdowns. The lead receiver for Michigan St was Cody White who caught 7 passes for 128 yards. The Michigan St defense allowed 405 yards of offense to Illinois, but only 36 yards on the ground, they gave up 369 passing yards.

On the year, Michigan State is now 4-5 overall and 2-4 in conference play which places them in 5th place in the Big 10 East Division. Quarterback Brian Lewerke has thrown for 2,012 yards and 12 touchdowns while also throwing 7 picks. Elijah Collins has rushed for 715 yards and 5 touchdowns on 143 carries on the year. Michigan State's lead receiver is Darrell Stewart Jr. who has caught 47 passes for 649 yards and 4 touchdowns on the season.

The Michigan Wolverines welcome the Michigan State Spartans to campus after winning their last game against Maryland by the score of 38-7. Michigan quarterback Shea Patterson completed 13 of 22 passes for 151 yards and a touchdown on the day. Michigan's lead rusher on Saturday was Hassan Haskins who carried the ball 13 times for 60 yards. The lead receiver for Michigan was Nico Collins who caught 2 passes for 65 yards in the game. The Michigan defense allowed a total of 233 yards to Maryland, including just 104 yards through the air.

With the win, Michigan moved to 7-2 overall and 4-2 in conference play which is good enough for 4th place in the Big 10 East Division. Shea Patterson has thrown for a total of 1,773 yards and 12 touchdowns against 4 interceptions on the season. Zach Charbonnet has been the Wolverines lead rusher on the year and has rushed for 559 and 11 touchdowns on 117 carries on the year. Michigan's lead receiver is Ronnie Bell who has caught 27 passes for 460 yards on the season but has yet to record a touchdown.

Michigan St has allowed 23.1 points per game on the season while giving up 23.6 points per game. Michigan St has allowed 323 yards per game this season while gaining an average of 365.9 yards per game. Michigan has allowed 31.8 points per game while allowing 17.1 points per game. Michigan has gained an average of 389.9 yards per game, while allowing 266.2 yards per game.

Michigan is clearly the better team coming into this game as their numbers on offense and defense are much better than Michigan State's. We believe Michigan will win in the Big House. But this rivalry is always a hard fought defensive game. The Spartans were already thinking about the Wolverines last week and got on the bus a bit early and got stunned by the Illinois. Spartans should be well focused this week. They will be a tough nut to crack this week as the Wolverines get all they can handle from the Spartans. **Michigan State covers the spread.**

Projected Score: Michigan 24, Michigan St. 21

Alabama - 21 Over Mississippi St. by 30

The Alabama Crimson Tide hit the road for a matchup with the Mississippi State Bulldogs. The Crimson Tide are (8-1) on the season. The Crimson Tide suffered their first loss of the season, losing to the 2nd ranked LSU Tigers, 46-41. The Bulldogs are (4-5) on the season and snapped a 4 game losing streak beating the Arkansas Razorbacks, 54 to 24.

Alabama got behind early and ran out of time in their comeback bid. Alabama fell behind 33-13 to LSU at the half. The Crimson Tide out scored the Tigers 28 to 13 in the second half, including 21 4th quarter points. Tua Tagovailoa was 21 of 40 for 418 yds, while throwing 4 touchdowns and 1 interception. Najee Harris rushed for 146 yds on 19 carries and a score for the Crimson Tide. Alabama was out gained offensively 559 to 541.

In the Bulldogs win over the Razorbacks, the offense was led by Kylin Hill. Hill had a phenomenal game, rushing for 234 yds and finding the end zone 3 times. The Bulldogs put up an easy 640 total yds, while only allowing Arkansas to gain 285. Mississippi State led 38-0 at the half.

The under is 8-1 in the last 9 meetings when this matchup is being played at Mississippi State. Alabama has won the last 10 meetings. The average score between the two teams has been Alabama out scoring Mississippi State 30-9 and the line this week so happens to be 21.

The difference here is the Crimson Tide is coming off their first loss of the season and will be ready to prove to the committee that they are worthy to stay in the top 4. They will attempt to put up as many points as possible in their efforts to get into the Playoffs. Saban surely cracked the whip in practice all week long. Alabama will be relentless offensively and defensively this week. Alabama will win and cover the spread.

RUSSELL WILSON TAKES DOWN UNDEFEATED 49ER'S AND TIGHTENS UP NFC WEST

Wilson May Be The Best Now

NFL Football Recap

– Four times, Seahawks quarterback Russell Wilson was given an opportunity to hand San Francisco its first loss of the 2019 season. That was one too many for the 49ers. New San Francisco kicker Chase McLaughlin missed what would have been a game-winning field goal in overtime, and Wilson and the Seahawks' offense set up Jason Myers for a 42-yarder that sent Seattle to a huge 27-24 win with no time left in the extra period. With the win, the Seahawks move to 8-2 on the season. The 49ers, meanwhile, fall to 8-1, allowing Seattle to inch ever closer to them for the lead both in the NFC West and overall NFC standings. Wilson nearly delivered the victory twice before his final game-winning drive.

-- The Atlanta Falcons (+13.5, ML +600) stunned the New Orleans Saints in NOLA on Sunday during the 1:00 p.m. ET window, while the Miami Dolphins (+11, ML +450)...(hey, weren't they supposed to be tanking?)...shocked the Lucas Oil Stadium faithful with a 16-12 win against the Indianapolis Colts. It actually hasn't been that long since two double-digit underdogs won outright on the same day in the NFL, as the Dolphins and Giants accomplished the feat Oct. 15, 2017.

The Dolphins had a little luck, as QB Jacoby Brissett was inactive due to a knee injury, but it's not like QB Brian Hoyer was some rookie nobody who hasn't played before. He tossed three touchdowns last week against a good Steelers defense. The 'Fins just came to play, and have won two in a row, as all of a sudden they look like an NFL-caliber team under head coach Brian Flores, who is putting his stamp on the team. After going 0-4 ATS in the first four games, the Dolphins now have a winning record against the spread, covering each of the past five outings.

The loss by the Saints might have been even more surprising, as QB Drew Brees looked good in his return last time out before the bye. Both of these teams had two weeks to prepare for each other, and head coach Dan Quinn likely bought himself more time as the head coach with the eye-popping win. The Falcons defense had shown no signs of an effective pass rush, or an ability to stop the pass, but they held the Saints to single digits in the points department. And that's why they play the games.

-- The two highest totals on the board were the Arizona Cardinals-Tampa Bay Buccaneers (51.5) and Atlanta Falcons-New Orleans Saints (51.5). It was a mixed bag. The Cards-Bucs game was on a good pace from the start, and helped in large part due to a 20-point second quarter, with 10 points for each team. It wasn't a slam-dunk 'over', but a go-ahead touchdown by the Bucs with 1:43 clinched the winning ticket.

As far as the Falcons-Saints game was concerned, it got off to a slow start and never really threatened to go over. The teams exchanged field goals in the first quarter. Atlanta had two touchdowns in this game, but inexplicably, the Saints had none. Hey, sometimes it's better to lose one like this than by a half-point or on a bad beat.

There were three games -- the Los Angeles Chargers-Oakland Raiders, Kansas City Chiefs-Tennessee Titans and Carolina Panthers-Green Bay Packers -- which closed at 49. The Chargers-Raiders game ended up going over by a single point, and it was a bit of a bad beat. There were 37 points on the board until the Chargers scored the go-ahead touchdown with 4:02 to go, taking a 24-20 lead. The Raiders charged back and posted the game-winning touchdown with 1:02 to go.

For the Chiefs-Titans game, it was looking like a close shave at halftime, with a total of 26 on the board, tied 13-13. The teams combined for 16 points in the third quarter, and 25 points in an explosive fourth, as the this game finished as the highest-scoring game on the board. The other game, the Panthers-Packers game, was a close call. The snow picked up in the second half, but it didn't seem to affect the sides too much. Head coach Ron Rivera did go with the 'analytics', going for two down 24-16, eschewing the extra point. While there is debate, especially in the Twitterverse, on whether it was the right call, it definitely wasn't helpful to the over. They needed a touchdown and two-point conversion after it failed. However, had the gamble worked, they would have needed a touchdown and then just the point after for a push. Of course, none of that came into fruition.

The 'over' hit in each of the three primetime games of Week 10, coming on the heels of a three-game primetime 'over' sweep in Week 9. The Monday Night Football contest between the Seattle Seahawks-San Francisco 49ers also eclipsed the posted 47.5. The 'over' is just 13-19 (40.6%) during the 2019 primetime schedule, a stark change from previous seasons when the games under the lights were high-scoring affairs. The 'under' was a perfect 8-0 for Sunday Night Football this season, but the New England Patriots-Baltimore Ravens (44.5) game went over in the SNF game for the second consecutive weekend.

Divisional Battles On Deck

-- The Steelers and Browns meet each other Thursday night on the shores of Lake Erie. It still isn't quite the rivalry it was in the past. It's now or never for the Browns. They won in Week 10 against the Bills, and they could get right back into the AFC wild card picture with a win, while dealing their rivals from the Steel City a tough blow with a win. The Steelers are 4-0-1 ATS in the past five appearances on Thursday, and they're 4-0-1 ATS in the past five against divisional foes. The Browns are 5-21-2 ATS in the past 28 against winning teams, and 9-23-1 ATS in the past 33 at home. However, they are 6-2 ATS in the past eight inside the division and 6-2 ATS in the past eight appearances on a Thursday. So what's the right side you say? Best thing to do is just buy DJ's Thursday Night Guaranteed Pick.

-- The Falcons host the Panthers on Sunday afternoon in Charlotte, and not many figured Atlanta would be coming off a win in Week 10 in New Orleans, while Carolina would be coming in off a loss. Despite their outright win as a double-digit 'dog the Falcons are still 5-16 ATS in the past 21 road games. The Panthers are still 5-2 ATS in the past seven overall, and they're 5-2 ATS in the past seven at home against Atlanta. The home team has covered in 10 of the past 13 in this series, too. The under is an impressive 9-2-1 in the past 12 meetings overall, while the under is 17-5-2 in the past 24 at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte. But have the Falcons turned the corner after their impressive win over the Saints? Birds looked really good, so we're not sure if the trend is your friend in this spot.

-- The Bills look to rebound after their first loss on the road in Cleveland. The Dolphins picked up their first road win in Indianapolis. These teams met in Buffalo back in Week 7, with the Bills favored by 17. Miami covered in a 31-21 loss, and they're less than a touchdown 'dog at Hard Rock against the Bills. Can Miami make it three wins in a row as an outright underdog? These are not the same Fish the Bills caught back in week 7. Fear the beard Fitzmagic!

-- The Jaguars and Colts lock horns at Lucas Oil Stadium, and Indianapolis looks to bounce back after a stunning loss at home. The Jags, meanwhile, are coming off a bye. It's a super important game for the Colts, who just a couple of weeks ago won in Kansas City and were looking like a surprise team in the AFC. How quickly things change. The Jaguars are 1-4-1 ATS in the past six against winning teams, but 3-0-1 ATS in the past four coming off a bye. The Colts have covered five straight inside the division. Jacksonville has dominated this series lately, however, going 7-0-1 ATS in the past eight meetings, and 3-0-1 ATS in the past four trips to Indy. The under is also 4-1 in the past five battles, and 7-1 in the previous eight in Indy. But teams coming off byes this year have been a risky play and a low percentage play thus far.

-- The Cardinals hit the road looking to avenge a narrow Thursday night loss at home to the 49ers a couple of weeks ago. Arizona is 5-1 ATS in the past six games overall, including 1-0 ATS against the Niners, and 5-1 ATS in the past six on the road. The 49ers are 0-4 ATS in the past four against the Cards, and 1-4 ATS in the past five at home against Arizona. The road team is 5-2 ATS in the past seven meetings with the underdog 5-1 ATS in the past six in the series. A tricky matchup to handicap here as the Niners come off a tough OT loss and a short week.

-- The Chiefs and Chargers will battle at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on Monday night. The Chiefs are 3-0-1 ATS in the past four Monday appearances, and 20-8 ATS in the past 28 against divisional foes. The Bolts are 5-2 ATS in the past seven against winning teams. Chiefs covered four of the past five in this series, too. The Chiefs defense is really banged up and got more bad luck when they realized they lost their top pass rusher to injury last week.

PRO FOOTBALL BEST BETS

Buffalo - 5 Over MIAMI by 12

Don't look now, but the Miami Dolphins are no longer the worst team in the NFL, as they have built a winning streak, sort of. A bigger challenge for them looms this weekend, with the Buffalo Bills coming to town. Check this out, the Bills are +4000 to win the AFC title, while the Fins are +200,000 to pull off that feat.

The Bills weren't able to capitalize on the struggles of the Cleveland Browns, as they lost to Baker Mayfield and company on the road last Sunday, 19-16. Josh Allen went 22 for 41 for 266 yards, and while he did not have a passing touchdown, he was never sacked nor intercepted in the game. He also rushed for two touchdowns.

Josh Allen's ability to get around defenses with his legs plus a superior supporting talent around him on offense should be all the Bills need to take down the Dolphins. The ground attack of the Bills will be a main weapon against Miami's problematic defense that is allowing the third-most rushing yards (146.1) per game. Conversely, the Bills like to run the ball, ranking 10th in the league with a 43.23 rush play percentage.

The Dolphins are not going to the playoffs, but at least they are trending in the right direction after scoring a 16-12 road win over the Indianapolis Colts in Week 10. They now have a surprising two-game winning streak, which they will look to extend when they meet Buffalo at home.

Ryan Fitzpatrick is still a steady quarterback who can manage a game at the very least when he's on top of his game. But it's the defense that showed up in the Colts game for Miami. But that was against backup Colts QB Brian Hoyer. The Dolphins picked Colts quarterback Brian Hoyer three times, resulting in a 13-yard loss for the Colts.

If the Dolphins can carry over that momentum and continue to build on their limited success, the Bills could be in a bigger trouble than most people realize. We believe that to be very unlikely against the Bills Josh Allen. As we mentioned earlier, the Bills will control this game with their ground attack and their stout defense. The Bills are 7-3 straight up (SU) and 6-3-1 against the spread (ATS) in their last 10 games. **Take the Bills to sink the Fish.**

Projected Score: Buffalo 26, Miami 14

TAMPA BAY + 6½ Over New Orleans by 3

The New Orleans Saints travel to Raymond James Stadium to take on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. These two teams have already met this season and the Saints won the first meeting by the score of 31-24.

New Orleans enters this game with a 7-2 record as it lost to Atlanta at home last week. Despite losing that game, New Orleans is still in first place in the NFC South with a two-game cushion. The loss was a bit concerning since it came off a bye week but the Saints are still in a prime position to make the playoffs so it should be viewed as nothing but a minor speed bump.

Bruce Arians has the Buccaneers in okay form headed into this game. Tampa Bay does enter this game on a high note as it was able to beat Arizona by three points at home last Sunday. However, New Orleans is significantly better than Arizona so Tampa Bay will need to play even better in this game than it did in its last game. If Tampa Bay is able to do that, a victory is definitely within reach.

New Orleans has to be extra careful that their lackluster performance last week does not carry over into this game as it will need to get back to its winning ways moving forward. We're not so sure that is as easy as it seems at this point. The Bucs played the Saints tough in their first meeting in New Orleans and only lost by a touchdown.

Last week, Jameis Winston ended the day with solid numbers but this wasn't a great game by him. He started off the game with a really bad interception on the first drive. While Winston struggled, Mike Evans did all he possibly could to make him look good, as he often does. He showed off his absurd catch radius on Sunday with a handful of impressive catches deep down the field. While he only had four catches, he was open a lot more on plays that Winston couldn't get him the ball. He still averaged almost 20 yards per catch and picked up several first downs.

Here's a strange fact for you, the Buccaneers are 14-2-2 ATS in their last 18 games in Week 11. This has been their best week of the year for the past 18 years! Also, the Buccaneers are 5-2 ATS in their last 7 games as a home underdog and are 4-1 ATS in their last 5 games as an underdog of 3.5-10.0. Mike Evans had zero production in the first meeting this year and if Winston targets him more this game, we expect this game to be close and go down to the wire. **Take the home dog Buccaneers.**

Projected Score: Tampa Bay 27, New Orleans 24

INDIANAPOLIS - 3 Over Jacksonville by 10

The Jaguars have activated Nick Foles from the injured reserve list last week, which means that the team's expensive offseason acquisition will be back under center when they meet the Colts in Week 11. That also means the good times with Gardner Minshew will take a pause. The decision to start Foles again looks to be the right decision for the team following the 26-3 loss in London to the Houston Texans in Week 9 — prior to the team's Week 10 bye — in which Minshew self-destructed with multiple errors and turnovers.

Foles hasn't played since injuring his clavicle in Week 1's loss to the Kansas City Chiefs at home. Foles' presence will give the Jaguars an experienced leader in the pocket who can manage the game better and take most of the attention away from running back Leonard Fournette, who always has a target on his back.

The Jaguars are 5-3 against the spread (ATS) in their last eight games overall.

The Colts were among the biggest losers in Week 10. How can they not be when they took a 16-12 home loss at the hands of the tanking Miami Dolphins? To be fair to the Colts, they didn't have Jacoby Brissett under center, as the quarterback missed the game with an MCL issue. Instead, they relied on Brian Hoyer, who proceeded to throw three interceptions.

The Colts have made it appear that there's a chance for Brissett to return to action in Week 11, but that is something that's still up in the air. For now, Hoyer is the probable starter, and if he does, the Colts might have to run the ball more than risk it in Hoyer's hands. For one, the Jaguars don't have an elite run defense, as they are allowing 120.2 rushing yards per game, which is just 22nd in the NFL. Led by Marlon Mack, who had 74 rushing yards against Miami, the Colts are 10th in the league with an average of 127.4 rushing yards per game.

We expect to see Brissett and if not, the Colts running game should control the tempo and the ball. We expect Foles to be rusty in his first game back, especially in a hostile environment like Lucas Oil Stadium.

The Colts get back on track and protect their turf in this important home game. Take the Colts to win and cover.

Projected Score: Indianapolis 27, Jacksonville 17

LA RAMS - 6 Over Chicago by 13

This is being billed as a fight for playoff survival on Sunday Night Football, when the Los Angeles Rams host the Chicago Bears. The defending conference champion Rams (5-4) have been installed as an early touchdown favorite despite coming off one of their worst offensive performances of the season in a 17-12 loss at Pittsburgh last Sunday.

Chicago (4-5), the reigning NFC North champ, snapped a four-game losing streak but still have plenty of offensive issues to address following its 20-13 home victory over Detroit last Sunday. The Bears scored all three of their touchdowns in a 6:03 span bridging halftime but still finished with only 226 yards of total offense.

The sputtering offenses of both teams have contributed to the over/under being only 41 points. It should be noted, though, the teams came nowhere close to this number in Chicago last year when the Bears won a 15-6 slugfest in which they held the Rams without a touchdown and to 214 total yards. For one week at least, the critics of Chicago's offense are somewhat less vocal. Embattled quarterback Mitch Trubisky's three touchdown passes went to three different receivers -- tight end Ben Braunecker, slot receiver Tarik Cohen and wide receiver Taylor Gabriel -- finally showing the accuracy that has been missing for most of the season. The win does not fix all of Chicago's woes on that side of the ball -- the Bears gained just 45 yards and three first downs on their other nine possessions -- but there is something to build on for coach Matt Nagy. The defense survived two potential game-tying touchdown drives in the fourth quarter and recorded five sacks. There will be some skepticism considering Lions backup QB Jeff Driskel threw for 269 yards and a touchdown in his first action of the season, but it was also the sixth time in nine games Chicago held a team to 17 or fewer points.

LA Rams had flashes of its offense firing on all cylinders, but it continues to struggle to find traction without running back Todd Gurley being a dominant performer. Last Sunday in Pittsburgh -- Gurley had 73 yards on 12 carries -- but none of those yards or carries came in the fourth quarter. Sean McVay is being asked repeatedly why Gurley got no action in the 4th quarter. McVay admits he would do it differently if he had a do-over. Jared Goff finished 22 of 41 for 243 yards and a pair of picks as the Rams committed four turnovers and went 1 for 14 on third down. After averaging 32.9 points last season, that figure has dropped off dramatically to 25.1 points.

Bears are 1-4 ATS in their last 5 games and 8-3 ATS in last 11 games as a favorite and 8-2 ATS in their last 10 vs. NFC. We expect the Rams to protect the ball this week and have more opportunities to score than the lethargic Bears. **Take the Rams at home to win and cover.**
