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Pitt Stuns UCF With Razzle Dazzle Trick Play

PAC-12 SHOWDOWN USC @ WASHINGTON

AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE (AAC)

-- The big story in the AAC was in the Steel City, as UCF was tripped up by Pittsburgh, 35-34 on a surprise razzle dazzle trick play. As such, the Knights saw their 25-game regular-season win streak dating back to Nov. 2016 snapped. Not only was it the first loss for UCF, it was their first non-cover, too. The 'over' has hit in their past two after two 'under' results to start. ... SMU picked up a nice 41-38 road victory against TCU, as the Mustangs moved to 4-0 SU for the first time since 1984, and they also improved to 4-0 ATS with the 'over' 4-0. ... Tulsa didn't cover, but they were able to top Wyoming, 24-21. They're 2-2 SU/ATS, which is rather inconsistent, but the 'under' has connected in each of their four outings to make them a favorite of total bettors. ... Tulane opened the week with a 38-31 victory over Houston, improving to 3-1 SU/ATS.

ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE (ACC)

-- Appalachian State picked up the 34-31 win at North Carolina Kenan Stadium, blocking a potential game-tying field goal to secure the road win. After opening 2-0 SU/ATS, the Tar Heels are 0-2 SU/ATS across the past two. ... Florida State posted a much-needed 35-24 victory against Louisville. While it still wasn't a complete game, as the Seminoles blew a 21-0 lead after 15 minutes, they were able to come back in the fourth quarter for their first cover of the season after opening 0-2-1 ATS. It was also FSU's first 'under' result after three overs. ... N.C. State held off Ball State, 34-23 in a game which saw the total end as a bit of a bad beat (see below). ... It wasn't quite a bad beat, but Clemson topped Charlotte, 52-10. With just over six minutes to go, leading 45-10, the Tigers scored a touchdown to not only flip the side to Clemson -41.5, but the total of 60.5 also went over. ... Miami-Florida survived a scare from Central Michigan, winning a low-scoring 17-12 game. As such, the Hurricanes are 2-2 SU/ATS and the total is 2-2 as well. The Canes are the picture of mediocrity.

BIG TEN

-- Ohio State roughed up Miami-Ohio by a 76-5 score after shaking off the Redhawks. It was just 7-5 after 15 minutes, but the Buckeyes scored 42 points in the second quarter to blow it wide open. The Buckeyes have managed at least 42 points in each of their four outings, and they have covered three in a row since failing to cover against FAU in the opener. The 'over' is also 2-0 in the past two, thanks to 127 points of offense. ... After a dismal offensive performance last week Michigan State was able to bounce back, winning at Northwestern, 31-10. The Spartans defense has been stingy, allowing just 11.0 PPG through four outings. ... In the marquee game of the day in the conference it was Wisconsin humbling the so-called great Jim Harbaugh and Michigan, 35-14. The Wolverines fell behind 28-0 at halftime and were never really in the game. The Badgers are 3-0 SU/ATS. On a positive note for the Wolverines, they were the first team to score against the Badgers in 2019 after 10 consecutive scoreless quarters to begin the season.

BIG 12

-- Kansas was back to their losing ways, falling to West Virginia by a 29-24 score. However, the Jayhawks put up a strong fight and proved their no longer going to be an easy out. KU has scored 24 or more points in three of their four outings. ... Oklahoma State picked up a cover at most shops with their 36-30 loss at Texas, but the Longhorns were able to pick up the much-needed marquee win. It won't get any easier for the Longhorns, as they visit Morgantown next week before their annual Red River Rivalry game against Oklahoma. ... Iowa State smashed Louisiana-Monroe by a 72-20 count. The Cyclones were impressive on offense, posting at least 13 points in every quarter, while outscoring the visitors 45-7 in the second half. ... It wasn't impressive, but Baylor topped Rice 21-13 in a low-scoring battle. The Bears might be 3-0 SU, but they're 1-2 ATS so far. It was their first 'under' result after a pair of overs. In fact, the Bears entered averaging 59.5 PPG. They're allowing just 14.7 PPG through three games.

CONFERENCE USA

-- Florida Atlantic socked around FCS Wagner at FAU Stadium by a 42-7 count. This game featured a little bit of a bad beat for total bettors (see below). ... UAB went for a 35-3 victory against South Alabama, picking up the early cover. While it wasn't a bad beat, over bettors (48) were a little unhappy with the result. There were 31 points on the board at halftime, but a total of just seven points in the third quarter and no points in the fourth. ... Old Dominion fired out to a 10-0 lead after 15 minutes at Virginia, and they held a 17-7 lead at the break. It was shades of ODU's win last season against Virginia Tech. However, the Cavaliers outscored the Monarchs 21-0 in the final 30 minutes, covering a 14-point second-half line while the 'under' came in for the game and the second half. ... LA Tech picked up a 43-31 win against Florida International. Perhaps the biggest surprise in this game was the 'over' (51) cashing after a scoreless first quarter. FIU, picked to finish second in C-USA preseason polls, is now 1-3 SU and 0-4 ATS.

MID-AMERICAN (MAC)

-- It was a rough week for the MAC, as the league went 3-6 SU in games against non-league opponents. However, Toledo was able to pick up an impressive road win at Colorado State, 41-35. However, the Rockets just missed the cover at both shops by a half-point. ... Kent State hammered Bowling Green in the conference opener for both. The Golden Flashes entered the game with a total of 49 points in their first three outings. Their cover was the first since Aug. 29, their opener. The 'over' has cashed in the past two for Kent State, too. ... Buffalo earned a little bit of respect back for the league with a 38-22 win over Temple as 14-point underdogs. It was their first cover after opening 0-3 ATS.

MOUNTAIN WEST

-- New Mexico outlasted New Mexico State in a crazy 55-52 victory in Albuquerque. When the Lobos and Aggies hook up there are plenty of points sure to follow. The 'over' is a perfect 3-0 for UNM so far, as they have averaged 36.0 PPG on offense while yielding 46.3 PPG on defense. ... San Jose State scored a huge victory for their program, topping Arkansas by a 31-24 count. It was the first win against a Power 5 opponent since 2006 for the Spartans. The 'under' has cashed in all three games for San Jose State so far, and they're a respectable 2-1 SU. The cover was their first of the season, too. ... Nevada posted a nice 37-21 road win over UTEP, moving to 3-1 SU and 2-2 ATS. The 'over' is also 3-1 in four games for the Wolf Pack. ... Utah State earned the 23-17 victory at San Diego State to move to 2-1 SU and 3-0 ATS. ... Boise State remained perfect at 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS after topping Air Force on Friday night by a 30-19 score. After UCF's loss, the Broncos are now likely the top Group of Five entrant.

PAC-12

-- The game of the day might have been in Pullman. Well, if you like offense, that is. Washington State was comfortably ahead by a 49-17 score midway through the third quarter, and UCLA looked dead in the water. However, the Bruins, who scored 42 total points over their first three games, and exactly 14 points in each, rattled off 50 points in the final 22 minutes to outlast the Cougs 67-63. It was an unbelievable game, and QB Anthony Gordon of Washington State tossed a school record nine touchdown passes and lost. ... California stayed unbeaten with a road victory at Mississippi, 28-20. It was a controversial ending, as it appeared the Rebels scored to cut the lead to 28-26. However, the receiver looked to have two feet down in the end zone and the play wasn't even reviewed. The Rebels were stuffed on the next play and time ran out, handing the Rebels a tough loss on their home field. ... Colorado outlasted Arizona State, 34-31, despite the fact they lost star WR Laviska Shenault to an injury early on, as well as pro prospect DT Mustafa Johnson. The Buffaloes are now 3-1 SU/ATS, bouncing back from their overtime loss against Air Force.

SOUTHEASTERN (SEC)

-- Tennessee was hammered by their rivals in Florida, 34-3. It was rather surprising to most, since the Gators were down to their backup quarterback after losing QB Feleipe Franks last week. Not to us, as this was Pres' Private Gold Selection of the week that extended his Private Gold ATS record to 5-0! Pres' popular [Private Gold Picks](#) are on fire. The Gators are now 4-0 SU/2-2 ATS, and the 'under' has cashed in three of their four outings. ... One of the more overlooked games, it seems, was Auburn-Texas A&M. The Tigers fired out to a 14-0 lead and held on for the 28-20 win over the Aggies as the total pushed at most shops. The Tigers are now an impressive 4-0 ATS, and their offense still hasn't started to hit on all cylinders. ... Alabama posted the 49-7 win over Southern Miss, earning the late cover. How late? See bad beats below, as the Tide were involved for the second straight week. ... Georgia-Notre Dame was the game everyone was talking about, and the battle actually lived up to the hype. The Irish had their chances late, but they fell 23-17 in between the hedges. The Bulldogs have allowed just 10.0 PPG, and the 'under' is 3-1 in four games for UGA, and 3-0 in their three outings vs. FBS opponents.

SUN BELT

-- Georgia State spiked the ball as time ran out in regulation, and Texas State celebrated on the field. They thought they won 27-24, but after review, it was determined they had :01 left. They booted the field goal to send the game to overtime. With a total of 62.5, OT was the last thing under bettors wanted to see. GSU scored a TD to take a 34-27 lead, and they just needed defense for the cover and under. Neither happened, as the Bobcats scored to tie it 34-34. After a missed field goal by TSU, the Panthers had a chance to win it and missed their field goal, too. In 2 OT, the Panthers again misfired, while the Bobcats kicked a FG to sink them 37-34. It was a push at most shops. ... Troy notched a 35-7 road victory against Akron. The Trojans have scored at least 35 points in all three of their games, but this was their first cover and 'under' result. The Zips are now 0-4 SU/ATS.

Bad Beats

-- In the Ball State-N.C. State game, there was a total of 59. At 34-16, the Cardinals scored a touchdown at 4:49 to go, making it 34-23. They recovered the onside kick and appeared to be in business. They drove inside the red zone with less than three minutes to go, but their QB forced one into coverage, it was tipped and picked off. Instead of a sure field goal to make it 34-26, and a one-possession game, and more importantly, 'over', the 'under' came through.

-- The Crimson Tide were leading 42-7 with 5:43 to go in the third period, and that score held up for the next 19 minutes. The Crimson Tide, favored by 37, appeared like they were going to win by 35. However, they ended up punching in a touchdown with 1:37 to go to get the late cover. For the second straight week the Tide were involved in a bad beat in the final moments of a blowout.

-- In the Wagner-FAU game, the Owls held a 42-7 lead late. The Seahawks got the ball down inside the FAU 5-yard line. They were stuffed several times and ended up turning the ball over on downs, failing to get it into the end zone. A touchdown would have pushed the total over (55.5), but the game ended up with a total of 49 points on the board.

-- In that Houston-Tulane game, the Green Wave were favored by four points. The game was tied 31-31 with less than 10 seconds left, and appeared headed for overtime. However, Tulane struck for a 53-yard touchdown with :03 remaining to win it 38-31, sinking those holding Cougars tickets.

-- The end of the FIU-Louisiana Tech game was gross if you were a Golden Panthers backer, catching six or seven. FIU scored a touchdown with :51 left to cut the Bulldogs lead to 36-31. It appeared you were in line for a nice backdoor cover, and a bad beat if you were a Louisiana Tech side bettor. However, just five seconds later the Bulldogs scooped up the onside kick and returned it 30 yards for the TD. It was like losing twice with an FIU ticket.



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COLLEGE FOOTBALL BEST BETS

T.C.U. - 16½ Over Kansas by 27

Kansas comes into this one at 2-2 on the year. The Jayhawks have taken out Indiana State and Boston College so far but fallen to Coastal Carolina and West Virginia.

In the WVU loss, Kansas QB Carter Stanley logged 275 yards, three touchdowns and a pick, while Andrew Parchment got most of the receiving work on 132 yards and two touchdowns off five grabs.

Over on the TCU side, they're 2-1 so far. The Frogs took out AR-Pine Bluff in the opener, then beat Purdue before falling to SMU last weekend.

In the loss, TCU quarterback Max Duggan had 188 yards and three touchdowns, with Dylan Thomas catching four balls for 70 yards. Darius Anderson had a great day on 161 yards rushing with two TDs as well.

Kansas is 4-1 ATS in their last five after an ATS loss and 17-36-1 ATS in their last 54 road games. The Jayhawks are 8-22-1 ATS in their last 31 in September and 2-10 in their last 12 on grass.

Meanwhile, the Frogs are 4-9 ATS in their last 13 overall and 2-6 ATS in their last eight after an ATS loss. TCU is 6-20 ATS in their last 26 home games and 2-9 ATS in their last 11 conference games.

Since scoring just seven points in the Coastal Carolina game, the Jayhawks offense has been better, with 48 and 24 points scored respectively. They've also allowed 24 and 29 points on the other side in that time, though.

All the trends point to Kansas, as the aforementioned 6-20 ATS at home for the Frogs is scary trend. Nevertheless, we see Kansas having their hands full trying to deal with an angry Frog nation. After losing the Metroplex battle against SMU last week, I'm sure Patterson will have the Frogs jumping this week.

Frogs QB Duggan is getting better each game and Frogs RB Darius Anderson is a serious breakaway threat that can score from anywhere. TCU should put up similar numbers as last week against SMU.

We're going to lay the lumber and take the angry Frogs.

OKLAHOMA - 24 Over Texas Tech by 35

Texas Tech enters here at 2-1 overall. The Raiders took out Montana State and UTEP in their first two games, then fell to Arizona in Week 3.

In the loss, Texas Tech QB Alan Bowman had 307 yards, a TD and a pick, and Armand Shyne had 68 yards rushing. Tops in receiving for the Raiders was TJ Vasher with 96 yards on six catches.

Over on the Sooners' side, they're 3-0 following victories over Houston 49-31, South Dakota 70-14 and UCLA 48-14.

In the UCLA win, Oklahoma QB Jalen Hurts put up 289 yards and three scores, and also rushed for 150 yards and another TD. Charleston Rambo was the top receiver there with 116 yards and two scores off five catches.

The Raiders are 6-2 ATS versus a team with a winning record and 5-2 ATS in their last seven after an ATS loss. Texas Tech is 33-16-2 ATS in their last 51 in September and 1-4 ATS in their last five conference games.

Meanwhile, the Sooners are 4-0-1 ATS in their last five after a straight-up win and 4-1-1 ATS in their last six overall. Oklahoma is 15-6-1 ATS versus a team with a winning record and 1-3-1 ATS in their last five conference games.

Texas Tech made some ugly stumbles in the Arizona game, but they had a nice roll going offensively coming into that loss.

Texas Tech is stepping way up in class after facing Arizona as their best opponent this year. Oklahoma's offense is going to let loose here and score often and the Boomer Schooner will be rolling often.

The spread seems like a boatload of points, but the Sooners are playing error free ball under the guidance of a great game manager in Jalen Hurts. **Lay the lumber with Oklahoma.**

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TEMPLE - 9½ Over Georgia Tech by 20

The Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets look for a road victory here to get back to a .500 record. The Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets have split their last six road games. Lucas Johnson is completing 55.2 percent of his passes for 135 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Johnson and Tobias Oliver have combined for one touchdown pass and three interceptions. Jalen Camp and Ahmarean Brown have combined for 135 receiving yards and two touchdowns while Jerry Howard Jr. has three receptions. The Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets ground game is averaging 173.6 yards per contest, and Jordan Mason leads the way with 249 yards and four touchdowns. Defensively, Georgia Tech is allowing 29.7 points and 414.3 yards per game. David Curry leads the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets with 22 tackles, Charlie Thomas has two sacks and Tre Swilling has one interception.

The Temple Owls look for their third home win to build on their 2-1 start to the season. The Temple Owls have won their last six home games. Anthony Russo is completing 59.7 percent of his passes for 944 yards, 10 touchdowns and five interceptions. Russo has three or more touchdown passes in five of his last nine games. Jaden Blue and Branden Mack have combined for 555 receiving yards and four touchdowns while Isaiah Wright has 20 receptions. The Temple Owls ground game is averaging 123 yards per contest, and Re'Mahn Davis leads the way with 211 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Temple is allowing 22.3 points and 276.7 yards per game. Ifeanyi Maijeh leads the Temple Owls with 18 tackles, Zack Mesday has 1.5 sacks and Harrison Hand has one interception.

The Yellow Jackets are 0-4 ATS in their last 4 non-conference games, 0-5 ATS in their last 5 games on grass and 0-6 ATS in their last 6 games overall. The Owls are 5-1 ATS in their last 6 home games, 4-1 ATS in their last 5 games in September and 39-19 ATS in their last 58 games overall. The under is 11-5 in Owls last 16 home games. The over is 4-0-1 in Yellow Jackets last 5 road games. The Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets are 1-6-1 ATS in their last seven games as a double-digit underdog. The Owls have failed to cover seven of their last 10 games as a double-digit fav.

It's tough to give Georgia Tech respect in this contest after barely beating South Florida and then losing to Citadel as 27-point favorites. The Temple Owls are tough at home and are the type of team that can load up defensively and grind out a victory. A team like Georgia Tech that's usually one-dimensional is going to have a hard time against this Temple defensive front. **Temple should be able to pull away in the second half and cover the spread.**

Stanford - 3 Over OREGON ST. by 13

The Stanford Cardinal need a victory here to snap a three-game losing streak. The Stanford Cardinal have split their last eight road games. K.J. Costello is completing 56.4 percent of his passes for 471 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Davis Mills and Costello have combined for three touchdowns and three interceptions this season. Connor Wedington and Michael Wilson have combined for 362 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Colby Parkinson has 17 receptions. The Stanford Cardinal ground game is averaging 115 yards per contest, and Scarlett leads the way with 321 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Stanford is allowing 29.5 points and 391.8 yards per game. Casey Toohill leads the Cardinal with 28 tackles, Jordan Fox has one sack and Andrew Pryts has one pick.

The Oregon State Beavers look for a win here to get back to a .500 record. The Oregon State Beavers have lost six of their last seven home games. Jake Luton is completing 57.3 percent of his passes for 675 yards, eight touchdowns and zero interceptions. Luton has 10 touchdown passes in his last four games. Isaiah Hodgins and Champ Flemings have combined for 505 receiving yards and seven touchdowns while Noah Togiai has eight receptions. The Oregon State Beavers ground game is averaging 229.3 yards per contest, and Jermar Jefferson leads the way with 270 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Oregon State is allowing 30 points and 452.7 yards per game. Shawn Wilson leads the Oregon State Beavers with 22 tackles, Hamilcar Rashed Jr. has three sacks and Nahshon Wright has one interception.

The Cardinal are 1-3-1 ATS in their last 5 road games and 1-4 ATS in their last 5 games overall. The Beavers are 1-6 ATS in their last 7 home games, 2-11 ATS in their last 13 conference games and 6-13 ATS in their last 19 games overall. The Cardinal are 7-2 ATS in their last 9 meetings and the favorite is 7-2 ATS in their last 9 meetings. The over is 13-5-1 in Beavers last 19 overall. The over is 8-3 in Cardinal last 11 road games.

It's been a complete struggle for the Stanford Cardinal, but the three teams they've lost to haven't exactly been the easiest opponents (USC, UCF & Oregon). We're going to give this team the benefit of the doubt. The Oregon State Beavers have done nothing outside of a win against Cal Poly and have been one of the worst covering teams in the Pac-12 the last three years. Stanford has also beaten Oregon State in each of the last nine meetings, and six of those wins were decided by double digits. This line looks like an overreaction to Stanford's struggles. Expect the Cardinal to get back on track as they drop down in class to play a much softer opponent. **Stanford covers here.**

U.A.B - 1 Over WESTERN KENTUCKY By 11

The UAB Blazers look for another road win to improve to 4-0 on the season. The UAB Blazers have won five of their last seven road games. Tyler Johnston III is completing 64.6 percent of his passes for 746 yards, eight touchdowns and two interceptions. Johnston has three or more touchdown passes in three of his last four games. Austin Watkins Jr. and Kendall Parham have combined for 460 receiving yards and six touchdowns while Myron Mitchell has eight receptions. The UAB Blazers ground game is averaging 153.3 yards per contest, and Spencer Brown leads the way with 192 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, UAB is allowing 14 points and 281 yards per game. Noah Wilder leads the UAB Blazers with 21 tackles, Garrett Marino has 3.5 sacks and Will Boler has one interception.

The Western Kentucky Hilltoppers need a victory here to get back to a .500 record. The Western Kentucky Hilltoppers have lost five of their last six home games. Steven Duncan is completing 58.8 percent of his passes for 790 yards, five touchdowns and four interceptions. Duncan has at least one touchdown pass in his last seven games. Lucky Jackson and Jahcour Pearson have combined for 284 receiving yards and two touchdowns while Joshua Simon has four receptions. The Western Kentucky Hilltoppers ground game is averaging 108.3 yards per contest, and Gaej Walker leads the way with 293 yards and three touchdowns. Defensively, Western Kentucky is allowing 29 points and 352 yards per game. DeAngelo Malone leads the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers with 27 tackles, Juwuan Jones has 3.5 sacks and Jeremy Darvin has two quarterback hurries.

The Blazers are 6-2 ATS in their last 8 road games, 19-7-1 ATS in their last 27 conference games and 4-1 ATS in their last 5 games overall. The Hilltoppers are 1-4 ATS in their last 5 home games, 3-8 ATS vs. a team with a winning record and 3-7 ATS in their last 10 games overall. The over is 35-16 in Hilltoppers last 51 home games. The under is 18-8 in Blazers last 26 games overall.

The UAB Blazers have covered eight of their last 11 games as a favorite. The Western Kentucky Hilltoppers have split their last eight games ATS as an underdog. The UAB Blazers have shown no problem winning on the road dating back to last season and have been profitable ATS away from home as well. The Western Kentucky Hilltoppers haven't shown much consistency up to this point and they're going to have a hard time finishing games if they can't run the football. **UAB is the more trustworthy team, so take the Blazers.**

AFC EAST UNDEFEATED CLASH WILL THE BUFFALO BILLS OUST THE PATRIOTS FOR 1ST PLACE

NFL Football Recap

-- The New York Giants (+5.5, ML +210) rallied for the 32-31 victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at Raymond James Stadium in the first-career start for rookie QB Daniel Jones, the No. 6 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. He replaced two-time Super Bowl winner QB Eli Manning, and his selection was viewed as a bit of a reach by some. However, if Sunday's game is any indication, the G-Men appear to have made the right decision in selecting him, as well as making the change in Week 3. He completed 23-of-36 passes for 336 yards, two touchdowns and no picks while adding four runs, 28 yards and two more touchdowns, including the game-winner late in the fourth quarter.

The Legend of Danny Dimes grows after a tremendous preseason. He went into the huddle at one point of the second quarter and said, "Let's f***ing score!", which was surprising to his teammates, as he reportedly had never been overheard swearing in the past. Elias Sports Bureau reports that since the 1970 merger only Jones and former Detroit Lions QB Eric Hipple are the only players to pass for two TDs and run for two TDs in his first-career start.

-- The Cleveland Browns were much better in their second home game of the season against the Los Angeles Rams than they were in Week 1 against the Tennessee Titans, but the results were the same - a loss and a non-cover. The entire secondary for the Browns was inactive, but they nearly tied the game up in the closing seconds. The Browns, who were blown out 43-13 in Week 1 by the Titans, moved inside the 5-yard line of the Rams in the final ticks. However, QB Baker Mayfield scrambled to the right and was picked off on the final play, falling 20-13 in a surprisingly low-scoring game. The books took a huge bath as a result of the favorite Rams covering the 4.5 points. We didn't take a side, as it looked like a trap, but we did have the under as a winner.

-- The over went 9-6 between Thursday's game and Sunday's entire slate, quite a bit different than Week 2 when the under connected in 13 of 16 outings. Looks like offenses are catching up to the defenses.

The highest total on the board was the Baltimore Ravens-Kansas City Chiefs (52) ended up covering fairly handily with 61 total points. That was the only total in the 50's. The second-highest total was the Houston Texans-Los Angeles Chargers (49) game, which went just under with 47 points. QB Philip Rivers was picked off in the red zone to end the threat of overtime, and the threat of an over ticket. The two games with totals at 48, the aforementioned Giants-Bucs game, and Atlanta Falcons-Indianapolis Colts games each saw 'over' results.

-- On the flip side, the lowest total on the board was the Tennessee Titans-Jacksonville Jaguars (38) game, which easily hits the under with a total of 27 points. It started out looking like it might be high-scoring, as QB Gardner Minshew led the Jags to a 14-0 lead after 15 minutes. However, a scoreless second quarter, and a total of three points in the third put the nail in the coffin for those holding 'over' tickets.

-- The 'under' is 2-0 through the first two primetime games of Week 3, with the low Monday Night Football contest between the Chicago Bears-Washington Redskins (41) still pending as of this writing. The 'over' is 1-8 (11.1%) during the early 2019 primetime schedule, a stark change from previous seasons when the games under the lights were high-scoring affairs. Officially, the 'over' finished 26-25 (51.0%) in 51 games under the lights. In 2017, the 'over' finished 25-23-1 (52.1%) in 49 primetime games. In 2016, the 'over' in night games went (52.9%) through 51 games. In 2015, the 'over' finished 20-28-1 (41.7%) in 49 primetime games. In 2014, the 'over' went 33-17 (66.0%) in primetime games, and the 'over' was 28-22 (56.0%) in 2013.

Injury Report

-- The biggest injury of the weekend occurred in that Giants-Bucs battle, as New York RB Saquon Barkley suffered a high-ankle sprain after getting his foot caught under a tackler in the second quarter. He was on crutches and in a walking boot on the sidelines in the second half. The injury didn't keep him from hobbling over and celebrating with his teammates following the win. -- Colts WR T.Y. Hilton (quadriceps) entered Sunday's game questionable against the Falcons due to a quad injury, and he aggravated the ailment. -- Patriots WR Julian Edelman (chest) left with a chest injury suffered against the Jets. He had X-rays which came back negative.

Kansas City - 6 Over DETROIT by 16

The Kansas City Chiefs look for a third road victory to start 4-0 for a third straight season. The Kansas City Chiefs have won seven of their last 10 road games. Patrick Mahomes is completing 71.9 percent of his passes for 1,195 yards, 10 touchdowns and zero interceptions. Mahomes has two or more touchdown passes in each of his last 14 games. Sam Watkins and Travis Kelce have combined for 595 receiving yards and four touchdowns while Demarcus Robinson has 10 receptions. The Kansas City Chiefs ground game is averaging 94.7 yards per contest, and LeSean McCoy leads the way with 158 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Kansas City is allowing 21.3 points and 395.7 yards per game. Kendall Fuller leads the Kansas City Chiefs with 21 tackles, Emmanuel Ogbah has 2.5 sacks and Frank Clark has one interception.

The Detroit Lions look for a statement victory to build on their 2-0-1 record. The Detroit Lions have split their last eight home games. Matthew Stafford is completing 62.6 percent of his passes for 831 yards, six touchdowns and two interceptions. Stafford has two or more touchdown passes in four of his last 11 games. Marvin Jones Jr. and Kenny Golladay have combined for 376 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Danny Amendola has 11 receptions. The Detroit Lions ground game is averaging 98.7 yards per contest, and Kerryon Johnson leads the way with 126 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Detroit is allowing 20.3 points and 394.7 yards per game. Tracy Walker leads the Detroit Lions with 24 tackles, Devon Kennard has three sacks and Darius Slay has one interception.

The Chiefs are 1-4 ATS in their last 5 games on fieldturf, 8-2-1 ATS in their last 11 road games and 5-1 ATS in their last 6 games overall. The Lions are 2-5 ATS in their last 7 games on fieldturf, 5-1 ATS in their last 6 games in September and 5-2 ATS in their last 7 games overall. The Chiefs are 5-1 ATS in their last 6 meetings and the favorite is 5-1 ATS in their last 6 meetings. The under is 8-2 in Lions last 10 games overall. The over is 8-3 in Chiefs last 11 games overall.

The Kansas City Chiefs have covered four of their last five games as a road favorite of at least three points. The Detroit Lions have failed to cover six of their last eight games as a home underdog of at least three points. The Lions have been one of the bigger surprises up to this point and you know they'll be out to prove this start isn't a fluke against one of the top Super Bowl contenders. The problem we have betting against the Chiefs is that they're too damn explosive offensively. As long as the line isn't crazy out of control, you expect the Chiefs to cover the number due to them consistently finding the end zone. As well as the Lions may have played up to this point, we don't trust them offensively to go toe-to-toe with a Chiefs team that's scary every time they touch the football.

Projected Score: Kansas City 39, Detroit 23

New England - 7 Over BUFFALO by 17

New England rides into this one at 3-0 so far. The Patriots have destroyed the Steelers 33-3, the Dolphins 43-0 and the Jets 30-14 in succession this year.

In the Week 3 win, Patriots QB Tom Brady had 306 yards and two touchdowns, and Rex Burkhead rushed for 47 yards with a TD. Josh Gordon led the New England receivers on 83 yards from six grabs.

Over on the Bills' side, they're 3-0 as well this year. Buffalo has beaten the Jets 17-16, the Giants 28-14 and the Bengals 21-17 so far.

In the Week 3 victory, Bills QB Josh Allen managed 243 yards, one TD and one INT, and Frank Gore had 76 yards with a TD. Dawson Knox led the receivers with 67 yards and a score from three catches.

The Patriots are 5-1 ATS in their last six versus the AFC and 18-5-1 ATS in their last 24 on turf. New England is 8-3 ATS in their last 11 in Week 4 and 20-8 ATS in their last 28 road games.

Meanwhile, the Bills are 4-1 ATS in their last five overall and 3-7 ATS in their last 10 in Week 4. Buffalo is 2-5 ATS in their last seven home games and 2-5 ATS in their last seven on turf.

New England has hit the ground running as expected this season, and their only semblance of competition this season will be Buffalo. How close the Bills can get to the reigning champs remains to be seen, but this should be an interesting matchup. Orchard Park will be rocking and the hometown fans will be rabid.

Still, as long as the line is in single-digits there's no way we're getting off Brady and the Patriots here. **Pats cover.**

BALTIMORE - 7 Over Cleveland by 17

The Cleveland Browns look for a statement road win to get back to a .500 record. The Cleveland Browns have lost six of their last nine road games. Baker Mayfield is completing 56.9 percent of his passes for 805 yards, three touchdowns and five interceptions. Mayfield has three interceptions in three of his last eight games. Odell Beckham Jr. and Jarvis Landry have combined for 449 receiving yards and one touchdown while Damion Ratley has seven receptions. The Cleveland Browns ground game is averaging 89 yards per contest, and Nick Chubb leads the way with 233 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Cleveland is allowing 22 points and 315.3 yards per game. Joe Schobert leads the Cleveland Browns with 27 tackles, Myles Garrett has six sacks and T.J. Carrie has one interception.

The Baltimore Ravens look for a bounce back victory to improve to 3-1 on the season. The Baltimore Ravens have won their last five home games. Lamar Jackson is completing 63 percent of his passes for 863 yards, seven touchdowns and zero interceptions. Jackson now has 13 regular season touchdown passes for his career. Marquise Brown and Mark Andrews have combined for 517 receiving yards and four touchdowns while Nick Boyle has eight receptions. The Baltimore Ravens ground game is averaging 216.7 yards per contest, and Mark Ingram leads the way with 257 yards and five touchdowns. Defensively, Baltimore is allowing 20 points and 350.7 yards per game. Patrick Onwuasor leads the Baltimore Ravens with 18 tackles, Matthew Judon has three sacks and Earl Thomas has one interception.

The Browns are 4-1 ATS in their last 5 road games, 6-16-1 ATS in their last 23 vs. AFC North and 7-19-1 ATS vs. a team with a winning record. The Ravens are 0-4 ATS in their last 4 home games, 0-4 ATS in their last 4 vs. AFC North and 1-4 ATS in their last 5 games overall. The Browns are 2-5 ATS in their last 7 meetings and the road team is 13-5-1 ATS in their last 19 meetings. The over is 6-2 in Ravens last 8 vs. AFC. The under is 5-2-1 in Browns last 8 games overall. The Cleveland Browns have covered five of their last eight games as a road underdog of at least three points. The Baltimore Ravens have failed to cover nine of their last 13 games as a home favorite of at least three points.

It's been three games and the Browns look lost offensively despite all of that talent, as the offensive line struggles with pass protection and Mayfield seems to have issues getting the time to find open receivers. The Ravens went toe-to-toe with the Kansas City Chiefs on the road, and they remain a physical team on both sides of the ball, a club that will punch an opponent in the mouth if that team isn't ready to match that energy. We have to lay the touchdown here, as the Browns are showing too many signs of being the same team they've always been.

LA RAMS - 9½ Over Tampa Bay by 20

The Tampa Bay Bucs look for their second road victory to get back to a .500 record. The Tampa Bay Bucs have lost seven of their last eight road games. Jameis Winston is completing 60.2 percent of his passes for 782 yards, five touchdowns and four interceptions. Winston has thrown 14 interceptions in his last seven games. Mike Evans and Chris Godwin have combined for 493 receiving yards and five touchdowns while O.J. Howard has seven receptions. The Tampa Bay Bucs ground game is averaging 121.7 yards per contest, and Ronald Jones leads the way with 164 yards on 31 carries. Defensively, Tampa Bay is allowing 25.7 points and 330.7 yards per game. Lavonte David leads the Tampa Bay Bucs with 23 tackles, Shaquil Barrett has eight sacks and Vernon Hargreaves has one interception.

The Los Angeles Rams look for another victory to start 4-0 for the second straight season. The Los Angeles Rams have won eight of their last nine home games. Jared Goff is completing 62.9 percent of his passes for 738 yards, four touchdowns and three interceptions. Goff has one or less touchdown passes in six of his last eight games. Cooper Kupp and Brandin Cooks have combined for 493 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Robert Woods has 13 receptions. The Los Angeles Rams ground game is averaging 123.7 yards per contest, and Todd Gurley II leads the way with 203 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Los Angeles is allowing 16.3 points and 285.7 yards per game. Cory Littleton leads the Los Angeles Rams with 26 tackles, Clay Matthews has four sacks and John Johnson III has two interceptions.

The Bucs are 4-1-1 ATS in their last six games when an underdog of at least seven points. The Rams have covered five of their last eight games when a favorite of at least seven points. It's fair to question how the Buccaneers are going to rebound after blowing a lead to a rookie quarterback at home. After being up 18 points at halftime, those type of losses can really carryover to the next week if a team isn't disciplined. The Rams have yet to really lay the wood to a team like they did all of last year, but the defense is getting after it and it's only a matter of time before the offense starts clicking again. This is the week, this is a bad spot for the Bucs. Give us the Rams in a beatdown.
